May God bless you with a giving, caring heart. May you know the full joy of serving others. Amen

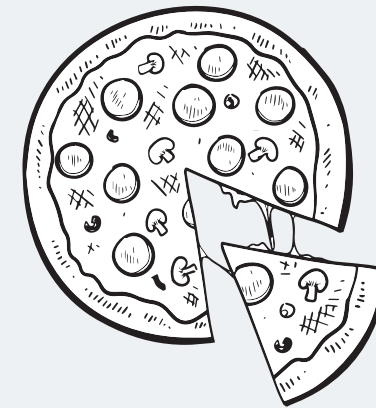
Sundays after Pentecost
