PLEASE NOTE: The first year of a VET Certificate is not available to Year 12 students (ongoing students only). All VET Certificates incur a fee each year of the two-year program. The fees vary from certificate to certificate. A deposit each year of \$100 is non-refundable on enrolment. Payment should be made to the DSC Main Office as reflected on Compass once an Expression of Interest has been provisionally approved.

Apply for a USI

It is now a requirement for everyone planning to undertake vocational or higher education to create a **Unique Student Identifier (USI)**.

What is a USI?

A USI is your lifelong education number, it is a reference number made up of ten numbers and letters. It's free, easy to create and stays with you for life.

You'll need a USI if you are a:

- new or continuing student undertaking <u>nationally recognised training</u>
- higher education student in a Commonwealth supported place.

For VET students, the USI gives you access to an online record of your nationally recognised training in the form of <u>a VET transcript</u>. This can be used when:

- applying for a job
- · seeking a credit transfer
- demonstrating pre-requisites when undertaking further training.

How do students obtain a USI?

To obtain a USI, students can apply online, it is easy and should take no more than 5 minutes. You will need **ONE** form of identification to create a **USI**. Acceptable forms of ID include:

- Medicare Card
- Birth Certificate
- Passport
- Citizenship Certificate

What certificate would you like to study and why?	
What will you hope to gain from completing a VET subject?	
Write down 3 or 4 things that interested you whilst viewing the industry video(s)?	
List some tools and or equipment you will need for this certificate?	
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What other aspects of studying a certificate do you think you may need to know about?
List any previous work experience in an Industry you have had? And what did you learn about yourself?
Any other comments?

Final Points to Keep in Mind

- After submission of this *Expression of Interest* form, an interview will be held with the Senior School Coordinators during Term 3 before any application is progressed.
- Final applications may not be confirmed with training organisations until the end of Term 4.
- There may be a material fee requirement for parents/guardians each year of the certificate.
- Students are expected to attend their VET subject for the minimum of ONE YEAR.

 This is a whole year subject for each year of the qualification (two-year qualification).
- When attending a VET subject, you will need to:
 - o have a plan to keep up with your school work.
 - Organise independent travel to and from your VET subject.
 - o Adhere to DSC codes of conduct while attending your VET subject.
 - o Use Study Sessions in your timetable to manage course requirements
- The last date you are able to withdraw from a VET certificate and have your reserve subject preferred is Friday 7th February, 2025.
