Most of Glen Eira is very well serviced by public transport the community wants greater frequency of services and on-demand needs met.

Some community members want better connections between services, and the ability to 'turn up and go'.

Liaise, review and provide feedback to the State Government with respect to major transport projects, such as the level crossing removal works.

Traffic and parking

Glen Eira is a car centric municipality. We need to change attitudes to driving for transport, reduce car ownership and encourage other more sustainable forms of transport — including car share schemes, car pooling and avoiding single person trips.

Car parking is reaching capacity but increasing car parking is expensive and reduces opportunities for other services and infrastructure.
