









The years China won their medals














Total amount of medals Australia's medal wins since 1988







German drugs

In 1974 East Germany started a program to artificially enhance their athletes athletic abilities by treating their athletes with performance enhancing drugs. This program lasted 15 years from 1974 to the end of communism at 1989.


In the 1988 Seoul Olympics East Germany won a total of 102 medals placing them second in the overall tally, a large number of these medals is possibly due to the drug program East Germany had been conducting since 1974. West Germany that year won a total of 40 medals contributing to Germany's total score of 142 medals that year. However this tally is highly contentious due that many of these medals have been won by drug cheats that didn't deserve to win the medals that they did.



This pie chart illustrates the difference between East and West Germany and all the other country's in the Olympics. In this pie chart you can see that East Germany won 14% of all medals Because they used drugs







Were Jamaica are getting there medals






