NEWMAN COLLEGE Scholarships & Bursaries



Each year, two thirds of our students receive a form of scholarship and/or bursary support.

The majority of bursary support is directed towards students from rural and regional Australia. It is possible to hold a bursary and scholarship at the same time.

Scholarships

Students do not apply for scholarships. These are awarded on academic merit, range from \$1,000 - \$5,000, and are paid via a remission in fees.

- · For first year undergraduates, these are based upon ATAR or equivalent.
- For returning undergraduates, scholarships are awarded on your University results (H1 average or equivalent).
- All graduates qualify for a Rector's Exhibition scholarship of \$3,000 p.a.

The College awards the following additional scholarships:

\$10,000 Scholarship

awarded to the DUX of a Catholic school*

\$5.000 Scholarship

awarded to the DUX of a non-Catholic school*

\$5,000 Scholarship

awarded to students ranked 2nd in their year from a rural or regional Catholic school*

\$2,500 Scholarship

awarded to students ranked 3rd in their year from a rural or regional Catholic school*

\$5,000 Leadership Scholarship

awarded to students that have displayed exemplary leadership skills in their school community.

\$7,500* or \$5,000* Scholarships

matching the amounts awarded to Melbourne Access Scholarship recipients

*up to 5 available



Bursaries

The College is fortunate to be able to provide bursaries to many students in the community.

These bursaries exist to enable young adults, who would not otherwise be able to attend Newman College, to do so. Bursaries range from \$1,000 to \$5,000 and are paid via a remission in fees.

Bursaries are awarded depending upon the financial circumstances of the student. Students wishing to be considered for bursary assistance need to write a letter to the Provost detailing the reasons for their application.

In this letter it is important that you address the following matters:

The financial circumstances of your family.

Details of Centrelink payments you currently, or expect to, receive.

Any other scholarships or financial aid you currently, or expect to, receive.

Other anticipated income for the year.

Details of the number of dependent siblings in your family.

Any other matters that you deem relevant to your circumstance.

Following receipt of your letter, your application for a bursary will be discussed with you at your interview with the College.



The College is awarding a guaranteed \$2,500 bursary for all students from select regional and rural schools.

Scholarships and bursaries are primarily awarded to students studying at The University of Melbourne. Students studying at other universities may be considered for scholarships or bursaries at the discretion of the Provost of Newman College.

Scholarships and bursaries are awarded at the start of each academic year and are contingent on the student's continued satisfactory academic performance and contribution to the College community.
