Central Registration and Enrolment Scheme for Kindergartens

The City of Casey's Central Registration and Enrolment Scheme (CRES) make's starting the kindergarten journey simple, offering families a single place to register for sessional kindergarten programs across the municipality. The sessional kindergartens that come under the CRES include both Council managed and Independently managed providers.

Kindergarten is an important early learning experience for children aged 3 and 4 years, providing high-quality, play-based programs that support their learning, development and wellbeing. Delivered by qualified teachers and educators, kindergarten programs foster safe, inclusive, and nurturing environments where children are encouraged to explore, discover and build confidence through meaningful learning experiences.

Through play, children develop essential skills in communication, problem-solving, physical development, social connection, and emotional wellbeing, creating a strong foundation for lifelong learning. All funded kindergarten programs are guided by the Victorian Early Years Learning and Development Framework, ensuring learning experiences are tailored to each child's age, strengths, interests and individual needs.

Supported Playgroups

Supported playgroups are free, weekly playgroups run throughout the school term in various Casey locations. Supported playgroups are facilitated by a qualified worker who sets up developmentally appropriate play experiences, supports parent-child relationships, builds parent confidence and capacity, supports social networks, and provides an opportunity to learn about local services.

Supported playgroups are currently available in Berwick, Clyde, Clyde North, Cranbourne North, Endeavour Hills, and Narre Warren South.

Maternal and Child Health Service

The City of Casey Maternal and Child Health Service is a free, community-based service dedicated to supporting the health, growth and development of children from birth to school age.

The City of Casey Maternal and Child Health Service is committed to helping parents navigate the challenges of early childhood, fostering healthy, thriving children and confident caregivers.

The City of Casey Maternal and Child Health Service provides parenting support, linking families to local resources, playgroups and community programs, while identifying and referring those who may benefit from additional specialist support.

The MCH service offers ten key age-and-stage appointments during important developmental milestones, delivered by registered nurses and midwives.

City of Casey Maternal and Child Health Service provide:

- regular health and development checks for children from birth to school age
- breastfeeding and transitions to solids advice
- sleep and settling support
- parenting information and support
- immunisation information and referrals
- early identification of children and families needing additional support and referral to specialist services

- group programs such as New Parent Groups, Mother Goose and Baby Makes 3
- information on local playgroups, early learning, and community resources

FAMILY SUPPORT AND SAFETY

The Orange Door

The Orange Door can help people who are experiencing or using family violence, or who need support with the care and wellbeing of children and young people.

The Orange Door can help if:

- You have experienced family violence, including controlling behaviour like someone monitoring where you go, who you visit or how you spend money
- You need help with parenting, or you are worried about the wellbeing or development of a child or young person
- Someone close to you is making you feel afraid or unsafe such as your partner, ex-partner, family member or carer
- You are a child or young person who doesn't feel safe or cared for
- You are using or are at risk of using abusive or controlling behaviour, or you need help with these behaviours at home or in a relationship
- You no longer feel safe to return home and need immediate support
- You are worried about the safety of someone you know

The Orange Door can work with you on your own, or together with your family members depending on your situation. Everyone is welcome at The Orange Door and you don't need a referral. You can seek help or support if you are a migrant or a refugee or do not have permanent residency.

The Orange Door can offer support for people of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander descent, including referring to an Aboriginal service.

The Orange Door knows that people continue to be affected by family violence long after the violence stops. If you have experienced family violence in the past and would like help now, contact The Orange Door.

How can The Orange Door help?

Once you contact us, we can:

- Listen to you and hear what your worries are
- Work with you to identify the help and support you need
- Support you with the wellbeing and development of children and young people
- Help you make a safety plan to keep you and your children safe if someone is making you feel unsafe
- Connect you to services that can help with counselling, accommodation, family violence support, mental health and drug and alcohol services, parenting support groups, services for children, financial help, or legal assistance
- Connect you with services if you want help to change your violent or controlling behaviour

Ways to get support

There are many ways to access help and support from The Orange Door. You can contact us via phone or email or visit one of our locations across Victoria. You don't need a referral.

Tell us if you have accessibility requirements, for example if you use communication aids or require an interpreter, including Auslan.

The Orange Door is open from 9am to 5pm Monday to Friday (closed public holidays). Statewide out-of-hours support is available.

Family Violence Support Services

Uniting Vic/Tas provides support for all victims of family violence. Family violence is any behaviour that is violent, threatening, or abusive by an individual against another member of their family, a partner or a household member. It includes any other form of behaviour that coerces or controls a family member or causes that family member to be fearful.

This includes behaviour that is:

- Physically, verbally or sexually abusive
- Emotionally, spiritually or psychologically abusive
- Economically abusive
- Threatening, coercive, or seeks to control or dominate the other person

Uniting Vic/Tas provides counselling and group programs:

- One-on-one counselling for adults, young people and children
- Group programs for adults, young people and children
- Referral pathways for adolescents

Family Violence Counselling

Uniting Vic/Tas provides Family Violence Counselling for families, with an emphasis on family violence prevention and providing a dedicated support system to help them move forward in their lives.

The School Attendance Support Program (SASP)

ParentZone

Anglicare Victoria ParentZone is a welcoming and supportive service that helps parents, carers, and families build stronger relationships, develop practical parenting skills, and create safe, positive home environments. We provide a range of evidence-informed programs and supports for parents and carers of children and young people aged 0-18 years, helping families navigate challenges, strengthen resilience, and promote healthy child development.

Our parenting programs include Tuning in to Kids (TIK), Tuning in to Teens (TinT), Circle of Security Parenting (COSP), and Parents Building Solutions (PBS). ParentZone also delivers the Beyond the Violence Program, a free 8-week program for non-offending parents who have experienced family violence and their children, supporting families to establish safety, rebuild relationships, and move forward following violence.

In addition to our group programs, we offer individual parenting sessions that complement and reinforce group learning, providing tailored support to help parents apply strategies within their own family circumstances and achieve their parenting goals.
