Dear Northcote Parents and Carers,

Northcote Primary School is looking forward to another great year of learning and teaching and would like to advise you of Northcote Primary School's voluntary financial contributions for 2023. Victorian Government Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. The ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education for our students, supporting our school to provide the programs, resources, and materials to foster learning outcomes. We want to thank you for all your ongoing support. Your financial contributions continue to make a significant impact on the programs we offer and the education of our students.

As highlighted in the Department of Education and Training's (DET) Parent Payments Policy (please see the one-page overview linked to this document) there are three categories for parent payment requests and these are outlined below, this document is also located on the Northcote Primary School website.

Curriculum Contributions: Curriculum Contributions are voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions: Other Contributions are voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities: Extra-Curricular Items and Activities are items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free in order to deliver the Curriculum. Extra-Curricular Items and Activities are provided on a user-pays basis. They include optional excursions and camps, optional sporting or music programs, and materials that don't relate to the curriculum such as school magazines.

For the commencement of the 2023 school year, teachers from every year level have organised classroom consumables from Paperchase. These will be delivered during January 2023 prior to the student commencing, this will enable a smooth transition for your child/ren to have the necessary curriculum consumables items required ready for their first day back at school.

At Northcote Primary School we make every effort to keep the cost of items and activities affordable for all parents, the total cost for the 2023 School Year for curriculum contributions is \$2.50.00

The School Council of Northcote Primary School determines the parent payments each year in line with the Victorian DET guidelines. Parent payments are requested to enhance the educational opportunities for our students, and further enrich the learning and teaching programs. Parent contributions in all forms are highly valued by our school community as they ensure our students can access a broad range of learning opportunities. At Northcote Primary School the financial contribution will support us to enhance digital learning opportunities, increase classroom resources and upgrade curriculum equipment, including science resources, numeracy and literacy.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES
