<p><b>School Review</b></p>	<p>Every four years, Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of Melbourne undertake a review which has two main dimensions - improvement and compliance. The School Review is used to support deep learning and ongoing monitoring of improvement throughout the four-year continuous improvement process (CIP) within the School Improvement Framework (SIF). This year, Sacred Heart is undergoing a review. Our reviewer is Mr Mark Workman and I have been engaging with Mark since Term 1 to prepare for the review. I have also engaged Martin Tennant, Safesmart Solutions, to assist in the preparation for the compliance component of the review, which is extensive. The first day of Term 3 will be a school closure day in order for the staff to work on the reflection and improvement component of the school review with MACS staff, Ms Janene Baseggio. Our review dates are 16th September, 2024 &amp; 9th/14th October 2024.</p>
