Marist 5A 3/165 def. St Peter's Lutheran College 40

Under gloomy skies, the Marist 5A cricketers certainly shone bright, delivering a complete performance to defeat St Peter's Lutheran College in dominant fashion.

Batting first, Marist set the tone early with positive intent and smart running between the wickets. The innings was built on unselfish partnerships and an aggressive mindset, with the boys playing with confidence and freedom. Jayden Dhillon led the charge with a powerful 27* (16), while Charlie Maher anchored the innings with 23* (23). Jett Killen added further momentum with an explosive 23 (14), helping Marist post an imposing total of 3/165.

If the batting performance was impressive, the bowling and fielding effort was equally clinical. The energy in the field was outstanding, with every player contributing and maintaining pressure from the first over. Jacob Schloss (2/2 off 1) and Patrick Silec (2/2 off 1) were particularly effective, striking early and ensuring St Peter's never settled. The consistent pressure saw the opposition dismissed for just 40 runs.
