Looking at the Readings

The age old maxim: "One cannot trifle with the liturgy" is addressed in the first reading and the gospel. Malachi condemns the worship practices of the priests and people of the day for offering second rate or imperfect sacrifices, lacking sincerity and abandoning their heritage. Jesus warns the scribes and Pharisees of their hypocrisy and being out of touch with the reality of the lives of the people and the ways of God. Matthew's criticism of these groups is not absolute. He notes the Pharisees fast and give alms to the poor (Matt9:24) and the scribes discern the good in the "old and the new" (Matt 13:52).

This gospel passage cannot merely be seen as a historical account of the practices of the day, they serve also as a critique and admonition of present practices within Matthew's community and by inclusion within future Christian communities. There will always remain the dichotomy of giving recognition and honour to leaders and responsible persons and maintaining our belief in the one true God and the example of Christ our Lord who came in humility and as a servant to all.

Did you Know

The first Reading is several verses from the prophet Malachi, an anonymous character. The name means a messenger. Passages from this book, the last in the Old Testament canon, are read only twice on Sundays, today and the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time year C. There are two main themes in the book: the failure of the priests and people in their religious duties; and the coming of the day of purification and security.

Liturgical Jottings Eucharistic Prayer part 9 Acclamations 2

The centre and high point of the entire celebration of the Mass is the Eucharistic Prayer, the prayer of thanksgiving and sanctification. The Priest calls upon the people to lift up their hearts towards the Lord in prayer and thanksgiving; he associates the people with himself in the Prayer that he addresses in the name of the entire community to God the Father through Jesus Christ in the Holy Spirit. The meaning of this Prayer is that the whole congregation of the faithful joins with Christ in confessing the great deeds of God and in the offering of Sacrifice. GIRM 78 The opening dialogue and the acclamations unite the assembly with the presider. They serve to show that the prayer belongs to the entire assembly and increases the participation of the congregation. This is most evident

in the Children's Eucharistic Prayer

REFLECTION FROM FR PETER

My concluding reflection!!! I trust over these years my reflections have enabled you a deeper understanding of our Sunday's and other significant days of the year in bringing God's Word to our lives. In writing these reflections I have endeavoured to have your life, and faith closer to our common thinking. That's not to say we have all been on the "same page". For I have tried to be relational with some events occupying our thoughts and where these have related to the journey I have shared with you.

As this brings an end to my presence in our Church community here at St Mel's, I am reminded of endings also bring beginnings. In one way the Rogationist Priests coming to our Diocese and here at St. Mel's and St. Malachy's, Nagambie led by Fr Rene and Fr Ruel bring a new dimension of pastoral and parish ministry to our communities. My prayer is one of this being a new era and one building upon the foundations of past priests here at St Mel's. For when all is said and done, the Gospel brings home the continuing call of Jesus to his disciples... not to be overburdened with the outward of appearance, or where to sit, or let alone being exalted!!! Our present inquiry through Synodality challenges these concepts reminding us of our common call through Baptism.

If anything I have tried to open before you is an equalness of ourselves as the Baptised in this faith community and whereupon this creates our equalness in Jesus' eyes and before God of our being in COMMUNION, with a way of PARTICIPATION, and realizing a common MISSION in opening ourselves to a new direction. It was at the Second Vatican Council a famous Church leader in Dom Helder Camara, a prophetic Bishop from Brazil said to his fellow Bishops... 'be a good thing to sell the gold and silver pectoral crosses worn by Bishops and give money to the poor'!

He himself simply wore a wooden cross! Food for thought! As Pope Francis continually sets the sails of the Church to the poor and outcast, might not today's Gospel speak ever more strongly for a Church in our time to see who we are with, seeing the one master in Jesus as our life and support.

In closing I offer you my continued good wishes and prayer and for St Mel's Parish to be a life giving force for goodness, generosity (for which you renowned!) and where the Eucharistic nature of this community expresses the unity from which you build together as the living Body of Christ.

First Reading: A reading from the book of Wisdom

Wisdom is found by those who look for it.

Wisdom is bright, and does not grow dim.

By those who love her she is readily seen, and found by those who look for her.

Second Reading: A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Thessalonians

Those who died as Christians, God will bring to life with Jesus.

We want you to be quite certain, brothers, about those who have died, to make sure that you do not grieve about them, like the other people who have no hope. We believe that Jesus died and rose again, and that it will be the same for those who have died in Jesus: God will bring them with him. We can tell you this from the Lord's own teaching, that any of us who are left alive until the Lord's coming will not have any advantage over those who have died. At the trumpet of God, the voice of the archangel will call out the command and the Lord himself will come down from heaven; those who have died in Christ will be the first to rise, and then those of us who are still alive will be taken up in the clouds, together with them, to meet the Lord in the air. So we shall stay with the Lord for ever. With such thoughts as these you should comfort one another.
