Learning a new language is challenging. It involves embracing the unfamiliar, accepting new challenges, and aiming for the impossible. In today's Gospel, Jesus calls us to unlearn the familiar language of the world and embrace a radical, countercultural way of living: "Love your enemies." "Turn the other cheek." "Lend without expecting return." "Do not condemn." At first, this seems impossible. Are we meant to cower in the face of insult? No! Jesus' teaching about "turning the other cheek" challenges oppression. In the ancient world, a backhanded slap was a demeaning gesture toward someone deemed inferior. By turning the other cheek, the powerless person forces the oppressor to acknowledge their equal dignity or expose their unclean intentions. This act is not passive submission but a bold statement: "You do not own or control me." It resists injustice without violence, asserting human dignity. St Paul reminds us that we are all made in the image of God, and Christ is the model of that image. Through Him, we are filled with the Spirit to transform our actions and attitudes. Today, we are challenged to resist the world's language of power and inequality. Instead, we are called to adopt the language of Christ—one of love, respect, and nonviolent change. The call to "turn the other cheek" is not about accepting injustice but about creative, courageous resistance. How will we speak this new language in our world today? Let us ask God to help us live this challenge and reflect His love and dignity in every encounter.



READINGS AT MASS

First Reading 1 Samuel 26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23

A reading from the first book of Samuel

Saul set off and went down to the wilderness of Ziph, accompanied by three thousand men chosen from Israel to search for David in the wilderness of Ziph. So in the dark David and Abishai made their way towards the force, where they found Saul asleep inside the camp, his spear stuck in the ground beside his head, with Abner and the troops lying round him. Then Abishai said to David, 'Today God has put your enemy in your power; so now let me pin him to the ground with his own spear. Just one stroke! I will not need to strike him twice.' David answered Abishai, 'Do not kill him, for who can lift his hand against the Lord's anointed and be without guilt?' David took the spear and the pitcher of water from beside Saul's head, and they made off. No one saw, no one knew, no one woke up; they were all asleep, for a deep sleep from the Lord

had fallen on them. David crossed to the other side and halted on the top of the mountain a long way off; there was a wide space between them. David then called out, 'Here is the king's spear. Let one of the soldiers come across and take it. The Lord repays everyone for his uprightness and loyalty. Today the Lord put you in my power, but I

would not raise my hand against the Lord's anointed.'

The word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God**.

As this earthly man was, so are we on earth; and as the heavenly man is, so are we in heaven. And we, who have been modelled on the earthly man, will be modelled on the heavenly man.

To the man who slaps you on one cheek, present the other cheek too; to the man who takes your cloak from you, do not refuse your tunic. Give to everyone who asks you, and do not ask for your property back from the man who robs you. Treat others as you would like them to treat you. If you love those who love you, what thanks can you expect? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what thanks can you expect? For even sinners do that much. And if you lend to those from whom you hope to receive, what thanks can you expect? Even sinners lend to sinners to get back the same amount. Instead, love your enemies and do good, and lend without any hope of return. You will have a great reward, and you will be sons of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked.

'Be compassionate as your Father is compassionate. Do not judge, and you will not be judged yourselves; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned yourselves; grant pardon, and you will be pardoned. Give, and there will be gifts for you: a full measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over, will be poured into your lap; because the amount you measure out is the amount you will be given back.'
