REFLECTIONS ON THE GOSPEL

GOD'S GLORY REVEALED AS GOD'S LOVE

It seems surprising that Jesus responds to Judas' departure from the Last Supper with what is virtually a cry of exaltation: 'Now the Son of Man has been glorified'. Judas' betrayal will trigger the sequence of events leading to Jesus' death on the cross. In human understanding, such a death is the ultimate in shame and degradation; for Jesus it will be the moment of 'glorification'.


To understand this, we have to appreciate the biblical sense of 'glory'. No human being can see God. But the presence, power and character of the unseen God is to be seen in the created world and in saving events—as, for example, the deliverance of Israel from captivity in Egypt. Such things reveal God's 'glory'.

The Fourth Gospel makes clear that the glory of God, revealed in a terrifying and remote way to the Israelites on Mt Sinai, has been made manifest in the humanity of the Son (John 1:14). And, as the story unfolds, it becomes clear that the high point of this revelation will occur as Jesus is 'lifted up' and dies on the cross. The crucifixion, while at one level the effect of human violence and treachery in unparalleled degree, is also his 'glorification' in that it supremely reveals the nature of God to be love (cf. I John 4:8, 16).

After Jesus' death and return to the Father, the community will no longer have his physical presence to make the divine love palpable in their midst. His 'new commandment' is that their love for one another must henceforth take on this role.



We still have a lot of Parishioners who volunteer in the parish but do not have their W.W.C and/or police check. If you are one of these volunteers please attend to your application ASAP. Your prompt attention to this matter would be greatly appreciated.

As a Parish we are committed to the safety of the children within our care and will do whatever is within our power to protect them.

Guide of what is required: -

- Readers, Special Ministers & Overhead Operators require a W.W.C.C.
- Finance committee & Counters require both a W.W.C.C and a Police Check.
- Special Ministers who go to nursing homes require both a W.W.C.C and a Police Check.
- Flower arrangers required a W.W.C.C.
- ♦ Anyone who does general maintenance eg mowing, gardening around the church require a W.W.C.C.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Jesus' actions are powerful, but they need some explanation. It comes in two forms. First, he says. "Now has the Son of Man been glorified, and in him God has been glorified." This statement means that in Jesus' actions we see the work of God. The Son of Man, in demonstrating such all-embracing and all-powerful love, is the manifestation and the reality of the very love of God. The ultimate expression and reality of God's love is when the Son of Man, who came not to condemn the world but so that through him the world might be saved, will make his ultimate, total and infinite act of love when he is lifted up on the cross. There is no possible fuller expression of God's love than this. The story dos not end there, however. Jesus issues a commandment - for his disciples to love one another as he has loved us. But how can love be commanded? If love is only seen as emotional, then it cannot be commanded, but God's love is God's total commitment. When we love as Jesus has loved us - by total commitment to any and all children of God - we make God's love visible. We show ourselves to be Jesus' representatives on earth his disciples.

Summary

- Today's Gospel begins with a summary statement: "When Judas had gone.." Sometimes the shortest statements convey the most powerful messages.
- Jesus gave a new commandment to his disciples. He commanded them to love as he loved them. This love demands action and when our actions mirror those of Jesus, we make his love visible in our own world. The Living Word
