WHAT WE ARE LEARNING

Please ensure you have access to Operoo, as medical and permission forms will be sent out using this platform!

READING

Students will focus on developing their literal and inferential comprehension by reading a range of different texts. They will be given opportunities to make connections between texts and their own experiences and share these with their class. A focus on rereading and asking rich questions will assist students in their ability to summarise stories.

WRITING

Students will plan, draft and publish personal recounts, narratives, poems, information reports and persuasive texts. They will have opportunities to develop their skills in adhering to text structures and selecting appropriate language features in their writing. A focus on editing skills will support and equip students to make appropriate changes and improvements to their writing.

MATHEMATICS

Students will begin the term focusing on Chance. They will practise using the language of chance, and will conduct chance experiments. They will build on their measurement skills by exploring length, area and perimeter. Students will continue to focus on the four operations, with a major focus on multiplication and division this term. As part of our daily tools sessions, students will practise their mental computation skills and times tables.

'Responsibility' - How can we be caretakers of our world?

Students will investigate the life cycles and various features of plants and animals, as well as group living things based on their observable features. To understand how the Earth's surface changes over time, students will explore the effects of natural processes and human activity including; erosion, extreme weather, climate change and waste. We will also learn about the earth's rotation on its axis and how this causes regular changes including day and night. Students will discuss and explore their own emotions through a series of lessons about emotional resilience. Students will also learn strategies for emotional regulation including breathing techniques, mindfulness, reflection and gratitude.

Students will explore the wonder of Creation. They will learn what it means to be a Steward of Creation, and will also explore the Indigenous Australians connection to Country. Later in the term, Students will focus on the Old and New Testaments and learn how story is used in the Bible to teach God's message. They will examine part of the Exodus story from the Old Testament and the parables. Students will reflect on the meanings of these for their own lives. Students interpret a parable and present their understanding.



HOME LEARNING

It is expected that all children <u>read for a minimum of 20 mins per night, at least four</u> <u>times a week.</u> Students are required to record their reading in their diaries each night. Please ensure these diaries are brought to school as they will contain log in details your children need throughout the year.
