#### **Mulloon Institute Rehydrating Your Farm Landscape program - upcoming event for Uralla and Armidale landholders**

Local landholders have been taking part in a fully funded landscape rehydration program running from February to June 2026. The program is being delivered by Southern New England Landcare in partnership with the Mulloon Institute, as part of our Regional Drought Resilience Plan. It focuses on practical, on-farm approaches to improving water cycles, managing erosion, and building long-term landscape resilience.

The Field Day on 19<sup>th</sup> February and the two-day Boot Camp on 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> March were well attended, informative and enjoyable. Participants learnt how to read their landscape, understand water movement, and identify priority areas for action.

The program concludes with the upcoming Boots on Ground Day on 14<sup>th</sup> May. This will be an equally interesting and practical day where participants will see techniques used, such as rock and brush structures, gully head cut stabilisation, and participate in more hands-on learning. It will be a great opportunity to see the ideas learned applied on the ground.
