
I really enjoyed this book, it was full of action and had interesting characters that try to save the world. It has all the character's perspectives, you should read the books before this one so you understand what is going on.


KATE IN WAITING BY BECKY ALBERTALLI




A good girls guide to murder by Holly Jackson
