You may be employed directly by a business or through a Group Training Organisation (GTO). A GTO pays your wages, organises your training and places you with host employers for practical experience. Ways to find opportunities include:

[The Queensland Commitment Scholarship:](#)

- Value: \$7,000 per year
- 5 entry rank adjustments + additional engagement and tailored supports
- Duration: Minimum full-time duration of study program
- For: Students undertaking tertiary study for the first time
- Available: Uncapped (no limit to the number of recipients per year)
- To Apply: Complete the 'Financial Hardship' category within QTAC's Educational Access Scheme and provide required supporting documentation

You don't need to apply directly, just apply for the Educational Access Scheme (EAS) and select the Financial Hardship category when completing your QTAC application

Academic scholarships open in August. The September holidays are a good time to get scholarship applications completed.

UQ Vice-Chancellor's Scholarships:

- Value: \$12,000 / year Duration
- Up to 5 years
- Eligibility: ATAR >99.90 (or equivalent)

UQ Excellence:

- Value: \$6,000 / year
- Duration: Up to 4 years
- Eligibility: ATAR > 99.00 (or equivalent) + significant leadership and/or community service

Overview:

- High-achieving students completing Year 12 (or on gap year)
- 'Unadjusted' ATAR considered
- One online application to be considered for both scholarships
- Encourage students to apply, even if in doubt of receiving the required ATAR
- Evidence of 'most outstanding' achievements (Years 11 & 12)
- Applications open: 4 August 2026

- Applications close: 20 November 2026

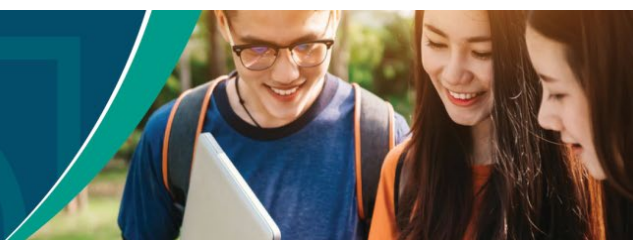

QTAC & Tertiary Entry



Check your personal emails and Junk regularly from now on!

QTAC and the Universities mainly communicate with you by email. Use a personal email address, as your school email may stop working after you leave school. Regularly check your inbox, spam and junk folders for messages, deadlines and offers. Don't ignore QTAC or University emails or texts as they expire within days of sending—you could miss an offer!

Direct Entry and Self-Managed applications

There are a number of private providers and tertiary institutions who prefer to manage their applications through the direct entry or the self-managed process. Direct entry applications are offered by:

Early Bird payment of your QTAC application

Pay your QTAC application fee by **30 September** to receive the **\$75 early-bird rate**. If paying by debit card, pay by **25 September** to allow time for the money to reach QTAC. If you can only pay with cash or need help with the fee, ask your guidance or school counsellor about a QTAC voucher. **Don't leave it late—the fee increases to \$159 after 30 September.** And don't forget that you have 3 free change sessions where you can always change your preferences if needs be.

Eligibility requirements and Merit determination

University and TAFE entry requirements vary and may include:

- Minimum age requirements
- Subject prerequisites
- A portfolio, audition or interview
- An essay, personal statement, questionnaire or test
- UCAT for some medicine and dentistry courses

Check your QTAC course information early, as some courses have early closing dates.

University offers are usually made on merit. QTAC gives you a selection rank based on qualifications such as:

- Year 12 ATAR or IB
- Overseas Year 12 study
- Previous university study, usually at least two subjects
- Completed Certificate III, Certificate IV, diploma or advanced diploma
- Bridging or preparatory study

Not every university accepts every qualification, so check each institution's entry and selection policies.

QTAC makes you one offer—for your highest eligible preference. This is the highest course on your list where you meet the entry requirements and required selection rank. If you receive an offer, QTAC will email or text you. Log in to your QTAC account, check the response deadline and reply on time or you may lose your offer. Regularly check your personal email, spam folder and phone, and **don't use your school email address**. [Check Key Dates](#) to be sure that you have all documentation and finalised your preferences on time.

Subject adjustments when applying to QTAC

Subject adjustments can boost your selection rank if you successfully complete specific Year 12 subjects. QTAC automatically applies eligible adjustments when assessing your course preferences. Rules vary between institutions and usually apply to study started Semester 1 after school. They are only applied to ATARs and are not applied to VET qualifications, Check each university's website to see which subjects and courses are eligible.

What is an ATAR and how to apply/get your ATAR

QTAC will calculate your ATAR based on your Year 12 results provided by the Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority. ATAR results are used nationally for tertiary admissions. ATARs are expressed as a number on a 2000-point scale from 99.95 to 0.00 in steps of 0.05. So, the highest ATAR is 99.95, then 99.90, then 99.85, and so on, down to 0.00. ATARs below 30 are reported as '30.00 or less'.

You must apply to QTAC for them to calculate it and you will find out on 18 December 2026. This registration is **COMPLETELY SEPARATE** to your QTAC course application for study in 2027. If you are ATAR eligible you need to apply/register for **BOTH**.

To register to receive your ATAR, go to the [QTAC website](#), and click on [ATAR Portal](#). Registering for your ATAR is FREE. You will need to have the following information ready:

- Full name (as recorded on your MyQCAA - no nick names or shortened names)
- Date of birth
- LUI number (Learning Unique Identifier number that your school will give you)
- Personal email address (DO NOT use your school address as it will not be active once you leave school)
- You will be sent a confirmation code so look in your Inbox and Junk mail for the QTAC email

What is the difference between the QCE and ATAR?

The Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) and the Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) are different and have different purposes. The difference is:

- QCE: Certifies learning showing the individual has achieved a specific standard of education at senior schooling level. The QCE may be referred to by employers and the general community
- ATAR: Shows a student's position (or ranking) compared to all other students in the state. Their only purpose is to assist with selecting applicants for tertiary study. It is not an indicator of a student's potential for career success or earnings
