# **Around the Grounds**

#### 6A

Marist 6A 29 def. Villanova 12

The Marist 6As responded with grit and flair in their Round 2 victory. After a tough opening-round loss, Marist 6A responded in style with a convincing 29–12 win over Villanova, overcoming the challenge of missing key forwards due to injury and illness.

The match's early stages revealed that both teams were still settling into their rhythm. Villanova, keen to bounce back from their trial defeat, started with strong intent, while Marist's new combinations took time to click. A hard-fought battle in the forwards set the tone for a physical encounter, with both teams trading blows in a see-sawing contest.
