In October 12th, 2006, Carlo got leukemia, and sadly passed away because of the sickness. He was only 15 years old at the time of death, which is a really young age to go. Right before he went up the stairway to Heaven (definitely was heaven, he was a great person) he said 'Mom, don't be afraid.' Probably because when Jesus became a man, death has become a passage towards life, being something not to flee from. Well, at least that's what he was most likely thinking when he said that.









It has not yet happened, but Carlo has been confirmed by cardinals that he will get canonized. He is not yet a saint, but he would probably be one by the time of confirmation. The date of canonization has been announced by Pope Leo XIV to be the 7th of September this year. And I've been told that confirmation will happen in October 5th.

- He was called the Apostle of the Eucharist.
- He enjoyed video games, and other forms of modern technology for the time that he was alive.
- He didn't learn how to code and do some other things from another person, but instead he taught himself how to.
- He is considered the first millennial saint and, as I said earlier in the slides, will be canonised in September 7th, this year.
- A few years back, Pope Francis held him up as a model for kids, showing how tech can be used to spread the faith.
- He did two miracles, and one was was when Carlo healed a Brazilian child that had pancreatic disease after the boys mum prayed to Carlo. The boys name was Matheus Vianna. Matheus' condition was severe, and doctors had exhausted all treatment trying to fix it.
- Carlo's second miracle was healing a Costa Rica uni student with severe head trauma after a biking accident, who's name was Valeria Valverde. Valeria's mum had prayed to Carlo's tomb soon after he died. Doctors also noticed that the hemorrhage in Valeria's head had disappeared after Carlo had healed her after making her take a CT scan.
