All Year 7s are offered the diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis and human papillomavirus (2 doses) vaccinations.

	Year 7
Term 2	Diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis vaccination and Human papillomavirus vaccination (dose 1)
Term 4	Human papillomavirus vaccination (dose 2)
Human papillomavirus vaccinations dose 1 and 2 must be six months apart.	

- The diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis (dTpa) vaccination is a booster dose for vaccinations received in early childhood.
- The human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccination protects against 90% of cervical cancers and genital warts.
- The School Based Immunisation Program is delivered by highly skilled immunisation nurses employed by WA Country Health Service.

School Based Immunisation Program 2022 – Year 10 vaccinations Term 2

All Year 10s are offered the meningococcal vaccination in Term 2.

- Older teens have some of the highest rates of infection of meningococcal disease in Australia.
- Meningococcal disease is a bacterial infection that effects the membranes that line the spinal cord and brain. Meningococcal disease is not common but can be easily spread and is life-threatening.
- The school immunisation program is delivered by highly skilled immunisation nurses employed by WA Country Health Service.
