The school football season is just around the corner again! In order to be ready for the season, we are seeking registration forms to be completed and returned with payment this term, allowing us to have coaches and equipment ready to go as soon as we return to school in Term 2.

Attached to this note is a registration form (including fee payment), medical information, and code of conduct. These forms need to be completed, signed and returned to the front office <u>no</u> <u>later than Friday 20st March</u>. It is important that we have all the information on these forms ready before the end of Term 1, as the competition begins in Term 2. The first games will be on Saturday 2nd May.

Registration Fees

Registration fees for 2015 will be \$45 per player (\$35 for second players in the same family). This is the same as last year. The registration form has an option for credit card payments. *Please note it is school policy that your child will not be able to play football if registration fees are not paid by the due date above*. If you are experiencing difficulties paying the fees please see the principal.

Coaches and Training Times

Teams train once a week after school, and games are played on Saturday mornings. We are currently recruiting coaches, and will provide details of coach names and contact details, as well as training times later in the term. If you are interested in coaching, please let me know ASAP by contacting me on the number below. All coaches will need to have police clearance before the season begins. This can be arranged at the front office, and the cost is covered by the school.

Uniforms

Playing tops are included with registration fees. The uniform is navy shorts and navy socks. However, if you already have royal blue socks and shorts, there is no need to change over immediately to navy.

Parent Support

As with most school sports, school football is run completely by volunteers, for the benefit of our children. There are activities requiring assistance on match day, including time keeping, goal umpires, oranges for half time, canteen and BBQ duties (home matches). Coaches and team managers will organise rosters to ensure all families share these activities across the season. Your assistance with this roster is greatly appreciated, many hands make light work!

Henley-West School Football School Sports Code of Behaviour

This code of behaviour applies to players, coaches, parents and spectators of the Henley-West football teams.

PLAYERS

- Learn the rules of the game and play by them.
- Never argue with an umpire / official. If you disagree, talk to your coach during a break.
- Verbal abuse of umpires or other players or deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent is not permitted.
- Work hard for your team as well as yourself.
- Be a good sport.
- Treat all players as you would like to be treated.
- Co-operate with your coach, team mates, opponents and umpires.

COACHES

- Ensure that all equipment and facilities are safe and appropriate to the age and ability of the players.
- Encourage and be positive with players, never shout at or ridicule them.
- Encourage players to develop their skills and to play by the rules.
- Ensure all players are given equal opportunities.
- Ensure all players respect their opponents, umpires / officials and opposing coaches.
- Be responsible for the behaviour of players under your control.
- Remove from the field of play any of your players whose behaviour is not appropriate.
- Assist the umpire / official to maintain control of the game.
- Take opportunities to learn more about the sport.
- Refer any unresolved issues to the Sports Committee or the Principal.

PARENTS & SPECTATORS

- Encourage participation by your children, but do not force an unwilling child.
- Understand that children participate in sport for their own enjoyment.
- Encourage honest effort, skilled performance and team loyalty, rather than the overall outcome of the game.
- Encourage players to play according to the rules and the umpires' decisions.
- Respect the umpire's decision. If you disagree, raise the issue through the appropriate channels rather than question the umpire's judgement or honesty in public.
- Applaud good performance and focus on the efforts by both teams.
- Never shout at or ridicule a child for making a mistake.
- Recognise the value and respect the decisions of coaches and umpires / officials.
- Advise the coach whenever a player cannot play in a scheduled game.
- Discuss any issues you may have with the coach and if not satisfactorily resolved, they may be referred to the delegate, Sports Committee or Principal.
- Do not tolerate the use of violence, verbal abuse or foul language in any form, be it by spectators, coaches, umpires or players.
