Dear Parents/Guardians,



You have indicated that you intend for your child/ren to participate in the OLSC Sacramental Program for 2026. In particular, your child would like to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. To do so, your child must be a **baptised Catholic** or have **been welcomed into the Catholic Church** and received the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist.

Your child is preparing for the Sacrament as part of their Religious Education studies this term and next. An important part of this preparation is the participation in a Family Sacramental Evening. This will take place **Wednesday 29th July** in the **OLSC Sports Centre**, from **6.30-7.30pm**. Attendance at this evening is compulsory, as the program is designed to deepen the faith and understanding of all within the family to allow the Sacrament to be celebrated with reverence and understanding.

We also request that you attend the two Community Masses prior to Confirmation, **21st June and 19th July**, as part of the preparation for your child's Sacrament. The Community Masses are held in the OLSC Sports Centre at 10am.

The Sacrament of Confirmation will be celebrated on **Saturday 8th August** in the **Tenison Centre, MacKillop College** at **1pm**. I would like to take this opportunity to also answer some initial questions you may have on the back of this letter.

As part of their preparation for the Sacrament, your child/ren will be receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation at school, on **Wednesday 29th July** as part of their Spirituality Day. We request that all Candidates be present at school that day.

## FAQs

### What should Confirmation candidates wear?

Candidates should wear 'Sunday best' clothing to their Confirmation. This may include nice trousers, a shirt and jumper or jacket for boys and nice trousers or skirt, top or a shirt and a jumper or jacket for girls. Girls may also choose to wear a nice dress also. Please avoid denim and runners if possible.

### When should we arrive?

Confirmation Mass will begin at **1pm**; Doors will open 30 minutes before Mass begins. Please arrive **NO LATER than 15 minutes before** Mass so that students can collect their stole and Confirmation Card, and take their sponsor to their seat.

### Who can be a sponsor?

Each Confirmation candidate should choose one sponsor only. The sponsor should be at least 16 years of age. For a just reason, the Bishop or the Parish Priest may give permission for a person of a lower age to be a sponsor. Normally and ideally, the sponsor should be a practicing Catholic, and already Confirmed. The sponsor should not be a parent of the candidate. Having one of your child's Godparents as their sponsor is a symbolic and meaningful way to highlight the link between Baptism and Confirmation.

### What about a saint's name?

Confirmation candidates need to choose a saint's name. This should only be a saint's name: alternatively, candidates may choose their own first name as their Confirmation name. Candidates should spend time researching and selecting a saint that inspires them as part of their preparation. Normally, candidates choose a saint of the same sex as themselves, although this is not a requirement.
