The <u>Certificate IV in Photography and Digital Imaging</u> is focused on students gaining highly practical photographic skills with a strong emphasis on collaboration, professionalism and hands-on industry knowledge. It is designed to reflect the role of individuals working as photographers' assistants. Students will learn to apply a broad range of skills in lighting, image capture, enhancements, manipulation and print output.

Students focus on all areas of photography in the certificate and, on successful completion, may advance to areas of specialisation in the <u>Diploma of Photography and Digital Imaging</u>.

Undergraduate Studentships at CSIRO

Our undergraduate studentships offer students exciting opportunities for you to gain experience in a scientific environment.

CSIRO offers <u>Undergraduate Vacation Studentships</u> which run over the Australian summer holidays and offers high achieving and promising university students the opportunity to collaborate with leading CSIRO researchers in their world class facilities. These prestigious studentships are highly sought after. Every year over 100 opportunities are offered to eligible undergraduate students in a number of disciplines.

Studentships offer students and opportunity to work on a real project in science, technology, or a related field such as science communication. Placements are full time and typically begin in late November or early December and can be from 8 - 12 weeks in length. Successful applicants are able to expand their skills and knowledge and there are often opportunities for formal and informal training and development during their time at CSIRO. Students are usually required to write a report on their work experience and will have the opportunity to present their vacation project to their peers at the end of the studentship. Vacation students are paid a stipend and, in some cases, may also receive a contribution towards travel and accommodation costs.

To be considered for a Vacation Studentship, students:

- need to be enrolled at an Australian University;
- will have completed not less than three years of a full-time (or equivalent) undergraduate degree at commencement of the studentship, however exceptional second year students may be considered;
- will have a strong academic record (credit average or higher);
- must intend on pursuing a research career in science or technology, or a career in a related discipline; and
- will need to be available to undertake a full-time placement for 8-12 weeks over the university summer vacation period.

Senior students considering a career in the sciences or technology might like to keep this program in mind. The CSIRO also offers <u>Undergraduate Traineeships</u> that might be of interest too.

As part of the <u>Bachelor of Engineering (Honours)/Master of Engineering program</u>, students are offered the exciting opportunity to study overseas with one of UQ's premier European partners. Snapshot of Monash University in 2022

- Named after engineer, military leader and public administrator Sir John Monash, Monash University was established in 1958.
- Monash University became a founding member of the Group of Eight universities in 1999.
- Monash ranks in the top 1% of world university rankings, and consistently ranks in the world's top 100 universities - <u>Rankings</u>
- Monash has over 77,000 students, with an international presence in <u>Malaysia</u>, <u>Indonesia</u>, <u>China</u>, <u>India (a research partnership)</u>, and <u>Italy</u>, besides its four campuses in Australia -<u>locations</u>
- Monash University is the only Victorian university to offer a Direct Entry medical program for students completing year 12 as well as a Graduate Entry program leading to the same degree – <u>Bachelor of Medical Science and Doctor of Medicine (MD)</u>
- There are ten <u>Monash Faculties</u> offering hundreds of <u>courses</u>, be they single or double undergraduate degrees, or graduate qualifications up to a PhD
- Monash has a number of student-run clubs and associations a great way to get involved and meet people <u>Monash Clubs and Associations</u>
- <u>Career Connect</u> is the Career Centre available to all Monash students. Students can access the many services offered be it for volunteering, part-time jobs, assistance with applying for work on graduation, etc.
- The Monash <u>Study Abroad</u> program assists students in studying overseas as part of their course. Monash has exchange agreements with more than <u>160 universities across 35</u> <u>countries</u>
- Monash offers more than 200 different scholarships for new and current students, from course fee subsidies to travel allowances, and payments for accommodation costs -<u>Scholarships</u>
- <u>The Monash Guarantee</u> is an alternative entry scheme for students to get into a Monash course even they do not reach the course's clearly-in ATAR. Students may be eligible for the Monash Guarantee if they:
 - have experienced financial disadvantage
 - ✓ live in a low socio-economic area
 - ✓ are an Indigenous Australian
 - ✓ attend a Monash under-represented school
- <u>Monash Residential Services</u> assists students in finding accommodation on campus, and off campus

Snapshot of Monash University – Peninsula in 2022

- Monash University's Peninsula Campus specialises in *nursing*, *physiotherapy*, *paramedicine*, *occupational therapy*, *education*, and *business administration* courses.
- There are approximately 4,500 students studying at the Peninsula Campus
- The Peninsula campus has a very <u>vibrant campus life</u> and is connected to the Clayton Campus through shuttle buses that run between the campuses every day
- There are three faculties offering courses at the Peninsula Campus: the Business Faculty, Education Faculty, and the Medicine, Nursing and Health Sciences Faculty.

Monash University offers an excellent <u>Diploma of Tertiary Studies</u> (DoTS) pathway program into a few of its undergraduate degrees. The pathway programs offered at the Peninsula Campus are:

Diploma of Tertiary Studies – Business: Upon successful completion of the DoTS - Business stream students can apply to enter into the <u>second year</u> of the Bachelor of Business Administration (Peninsula) OR the Bachelor of Business (Caulfield) depending upon their mathematics preparation, and their average marks in the DoTS program.

Diploma of Tertiary Studies – Education: Upon successful completion of the DoTS -Education stream students can apply to enter into the <u>second year</u> of the Bachelor of Education (Honours) in several specialisations.

Diploma of Tertiary Studies – Nursing: Upon successful completion of the DoTS - Nursing stream students can apply to enter into the <u>second year</u> of the Bachelor of Nursing.
