First Aid

At OSH Club, your child's safety is paramount. All permanent staff members are trained in First aid, CPR, and anaphylaxis. Educators assess the risks and area before the beginning of each session.

Unfortunately, Injuries and accidents can still occur. In this case If your child has been treated with first aid educators will write up an incident report, you will be informed and be able to view and sign the report next time you are in service.

Child Safe Standard 6

Here at OSHClub, we follow the Child Safe Standards which is a list of 11 standards that we need to implement to keep children safe. Child Safety Standard 6 is: People working with children and young people are suitable and supported to reflect child safety and wellbeing values in practice. We embed this standard by ensuring all staff members are trained and well equipped with the appropriate knowledge and training concerning child safety, engaging in critical reflection tools/questions, and implementing fortnightly wellbeing explorations.
