LITERACY

This term, students will explore two captivating texts: 'Matilda' by Roald Dahl and 'Off We Go Around Australia' by Roland Harvey. Over nine weeks, the unit will focus on developing literacy and language skills through immersive literature studies and engaging activities.

In the first six weeks, we will dive into 'Matilda', where students will explore key themes like individuality, resilience, and justice. Foci includes expanding vocabulary, analysing characters and events, and crafting narratives. Grammar and writing tasks will support their understanding of narrative and persuasive text structures, sentence construction, and punctuation.

The final three weeks shift to 'Off We Go Around Australia', introducing students to Australian geography, culture, and history through interactive text-based lessons. This portion emphasizes creative and descriptive writing, enabling students to reflect on Australia's unique landscapes and traditions.

Students will continue to use the PLD phonics program throughout this year based on their area of need. We will focus on segmenting and blending sounds and breaking words up into their syllables.

Throughout the unit, we will integrate grammar, spelling, and reading fluency practice. Weekly lessons will also encourage critical thinking and personal connections to the texts, fostering a love of reading and writing.

MATHS

In Grade 3/4, students will deepen their understanding of key mathematical strands, including Number, Algebra, Measurement, Space, and Statistics. The exploration of open-ended prompts will

enable students to gain real-world problem-solving skills. This focus aims to expand their understanding of how mathematics connects to their daily lives and the world around them.

Our program emphasizes the four proficiencies to support well-rounded mathematical development:

Fluency: Developing confidence and efficiency in calculations.

Understanding: Building a solid foundation by encouraging students to explain mathematical concepts and connect them to their prior knowledge.

Reasoning: Using logical thinking to explain and justify answers.

Problem-Solving: Applying strategies to tackle practical and challenging problems.

Students will work both independently and collaboratively in group tasks to build confidence, teamwork, and a comprehensive understanding of mathematical concepts. The key concepts that will be visited in Term 1 include:

- Place Value:
 - Whole numbers
 - Odd and Even numbers
 - Ordering numbers from smallest to greatest
 - Partitioning numbers in expanded form
 - Follow counting patterns
- Fractions and Decimals:
 - Fraction properties naming the numerator and denominator.
 - Fraction wall creating and naming unit fractions
 - Placing fractions on a number line
- Measurement
 - Using scaled instruments to measure and compare length

DISCOVERY

In Term 1, students will explore Civics and Citizenship by inquiring into why people make rules and laws. They will consider the purpose of rules within a local context and compare this to other areas in Australia.

- Why do people make rules and laws?
- Who benefits from the rules that are created?
- How can you make a positive difference in the creation of new rules?

Students will create a discovery question around mid-term. Teachers will encourage and scaffold students' abilities in researching and answering their questions in detail. Students will take part in flexible, creative and critical thinking to answer their question in a way that represents their interests, capabilities and strengths.

HOMEWORK

Homework will be distributed on Mondays and needs to be completed and returned to the classroom teacher on Fridays.

Homework will consist of:

- Daily spelling words from the PLD Phonics program (tailored to the needs of your child)

- Daily reading practice- either levelled text, or a 'Just Right' library book Maths fluency task. -
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
