**Liturgical Jottings** Letter to the Romans (1)

From the 9<sup>th</sup> to the 24<sup>th</sup> Sundays in Ordinary Time, we read, this year, St Paul's Letter to the Romans. The Apostle writes to the Christians in Rome to expound his preaching, in broad outline, hence, the tone of the letter which has a more rigorous structure than his other letters. One of the core ideas of Paul's doctrine regards the salvation of all humankind through God's grace, granted to those who believe in Jesus Christ. None of boast of can our own 115 righteous-ness, not even that coming from the Law. There is only one true righteousness which comes from God and is received through faith.

Paul had not yet visited Rome. He did not know the city's Christian community. Besides, he had a rule not to meddle where others had preached the gospel (Rom 5:20). As a result, his letter does not deal with the concrete questions that might have faced the community.

# Looking at the Readings

The demands of discipleship can be very difficult. The strength that is needed to continue on the chosen path despite its hardships can come only from God. We live in a world that desperately needs to hear the call to conversion, but it is a world that is subject to the death that entered it through the sin of Adam. Those who answer the call of God may have to face the hostility of this world, because their values and their commitment to righteousness threaten its moorings. To commit oneself to the reign of God is to challenge the reign of the world, and this can make one very unpopular. In the midst of this suffering we can find strength in the promises of God, and we believe that God is faithful to these promises.

Only half of today's picture is bleak. The other half is radiant with hope. Paul assures us that the gracious gift that God offers us is far greater that the transgressions brought on by sin. This gracious gift is Jesus Christ himself. The gift exceeds anything for which we might have hoped. He is the comfort that will carry us through our disappointments. He is the strength that will enable us to endure the misunderstanding and hardship that come with discipleship. We are called to acknowledge him before the world, and we are promised that if we do, he will acknowledge us before God. There is light even in the midst of darkness. There is hope even in the midst of suffering. © *Dianne Bergant CSA*

# REFLECTION FROM FR PETER

Today's Gospel has Jesus instructing them not to be fearful as to the mission entrusted to them. In part this involves them not being worthless, for the Word has been entrusted to them to be bold because of Jesus' trust of them. Ours is a time where in today's feeling for the Church to see people who are bold enough and to have courage in offering the Good News in places we might fear to tread.

In offering this reflection I am mindful of the nature of one word called SYNODALITY. It's a word coming out of the Second Vatican Council where invitation was given to the universal Church of listening to the voice of the Holy Spirit and where this needs urgent hearing in our time and place. As I have previously mentioned a Synod of the world's Catholic Bishops are meeting in Rome this coming October. Where 3 words around Synodality are occupying our thoughts.... COMMUNION, PARTICIPATION and MISSION. I will try and break down these words for your consideration....

COMMUNION.... A word vital to our being sisters and brothers in union with each other. Being companions on B the journey as we sometimes have sung about. This word Communion is about our togetherness.

. A question to ponder: 'What helps our being Catholic people who can take within us ways of including others? or meeting one we don't know?

PARTICIPATION.... A word seeking our discernment. Finding a balance with one's faith and shared responsibility from Baptism.

. A question to ponder: What new methods can you see to encourage a new sense for change in being a relevant community in living the Good News?

MISSION.... A word expressing our common calling in making Jesus' Good News being heard in the situation of our identity as people in St. Mel's community of faith.

. A question to ponder: In what ways could you and ourselves dialogue and collaborate in our political landscape, civil society, with the poor and disadvantaged?

Additionally, there are resources to assist in discernment particularly <u>CSTs for the Journey</u> National Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council (NATSICC) is the peak advisory body to the Australian Catholic Bishops.



**Second Reading** A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans Having been buried with him through baptism, we shall walk in a new life. When we were baptised in Christ Jesus we were baptised in his death; in other words, when we were baptised we went into the tomb with him and joined him in death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the Father's glory, we too might live a new life.

But we believe that having died with Christ we shall return to life with him: Christ, as we know, having been raised from the dead will never die again. Death has no power over him any more. When he died, he died, once for all, to sin, so his life now is life with God; and in that way, you too must consider yourselves to be dead to sin but alive for God in Christ Jesus. **The Word of the Lord**
