#### **Looking at the Readings**

Two parables about vineyards in the readings today both end in disaster. From the prophet Isaiah, the property is fitted out, the vineyard is properly planted and tended but produces sour and bad grapes and then destroyed. Jesus' parable tells of a similar building, planting and tending, but this time the harvest is good but the owner is robbed of its produce and his son is killed by the workers he trusted. Australian wine makers reflect another twist to this fragile industry when their great produce faces uncertain markets.

In the first parable, the vineyard is the image of God's people, or as expressed in the Responsorial Psalm: "The vineyard of the Lord is the house of Israel." In the second parable the owner's son is an image of Jesus, the workers who rejected the son are the ones Jesus addressed the parable to: "the chief priests and the elders of the people."

Today, "the Church receives the parable as an admonition addressed to itself. It cannot fail to do so because Matthew has too consistently insisted on the necessity of bearing fruit. The Church will be faithful to its mission and election only if it welcomes the prophets whom God does not cease to send it, only if it practices the gospel of his Son, only if it remains faithful through everything. The vineyard song still resounds in today's Church: Master of the vineyard, do not reject the work of your hands." (Year of the Lord Vol.4 p.213)

#### Feast of the Week Saint John Henry Newman 9 Oct.

As an Anglican clergyman for over 20 years he won renown as a preacher, theologian and one of the leaders of the Oxford Movement. On 9 October 1845 he was received into the Catholic Church and ordained priest on 30 May 1847. He was an influential writer on many subjects: the development of Christian doctrine, the true understanding of conscience, faith and reason, the role of the laity, and university education and author of several hymns. He died in 1890 and canonised in 2019.

# **Liturgical Jottings**Eucharistic Prayer part 5 Oblation

"The oblation is the offering by which, the Church gathered here and now, offers the unblemished sacrificial Victim in the Holy Spirit to the Father. The Church's intention, indeed, is that the faithful not only offer this unblemished sacrificial Victim but also learn to offer their very selves, and so day by day to be brought, through the mediation of Christ, into unity with God and with each other, so that God may at last be all in all. GIRM 79f

Oblation was once a name for the Eucharist yet while focussing of the offering of the material elements of the bread and wine the name also included offering of ourselves, offering of praise to God, offering our prayers. "Offering" and "offer" is mentioned seven times during the First Eucharistic Prayer, and less in the others.

#### REFLECTION FROM FR PETER

Absentee Landowners were well known to Galilean peasants. Sometimes they would rent out their land to tenant farmers who worked the land and then received a certain meager percentage of the crop's return. At harvest time, the owner's agents would be sent to collect his dues. The vineyard in the parable we hear today being the third of a trilogy of vineyard stories over the past Sundays has been created by the landowner God who planted it, protected it, built a winepress for the crushing of grapes, a watchtower to give guidance and protection.

#### **STEWARDSHIP**

This Sunday we take up the theme of COMMUNION. We associate this word through receiving of the Eucharist. The very means by where Communion engages our life in the God drawing intimately through Jesus, the essence of our communion. In offering this theme for this week, I liken the word COMMUNION with all we can BUILD. Often times through the cycle of the Church year we celebrate the Apostles. The APOSTLES are a continuing legacy for foundation upon who we build today. It was their human capacity despite their weakness Jesus saw a purpose for building. For example, Peter, the first of Popes was granted the keys, linking earth with heaven.

Here at St. Mel's we have experienced the great legacy given by the Scalabrinian Priests, who to this day are fondly remembered. They built along with the Religious Sisters of the Divine Zeal and the Sisters of Mercy who both laid foundations in whose story of vision gives us a vision and presence, passionately given still by Sr. Pam Barlow RSM giving outreach and confidence of all we become today. St. Mel's can be grateful for all Sr. Pam brings and gives in her ministry.

May this coming week be one where in your well-considered judgment and way of generosity see your personal capacity as a BUILDER IN FAITH. To build is to see a lived thought of COMMUNION allowing us to see together as Jesus seeks of us being his Kingdom people. From the Gospel, we see our place in the vineyard equally as tenants and where each is given their proper reward.

Plenary Keynote Presentation.
