Important Information from Edmund Rice Education Australia

In Woodchatta during Week 2, the College provided the St Pius X Community with a letter from the Trustees of Edmund Rice Education Australia (EREA).

The letter outlined the Trustees' moral decision to provide financial support to the Christian Brothers in addressing redress matters for survivors of abuse that occurred in schools that are now governed by EREA.

Continually update grade of College facilities at Chatswood

Over the mid-year break, the College began its refurbishment of the College Gym and the amenities connected to the Gym. These upgrades will be staged over the course of the next six months with Stage One completed.

Stage One included:

- ✓ This will commence at the beginning of the summer holidays as the floor will take six weeks to cure.

P&F Treasurer's Reports - Club Funding FY27-29
