RELIGION



Over the next few weeks the students will explore different images and descriptions of God in the Old and New Testaments. They will come to the understanding that every human is unique and loved by God. They will discover that God loves us all no matter what, which is why we are placed on earth. Everyone has a purpose and as Catholics we are called to share our talents for the greater good of humankind.

October is also the **Month of the Rosary** - the whole school will be praying the Rosary each Thursday afternoon. It would be great if you could also practise with your child at home. Do you have any rosary beads at home they could use or bring it to school to help them say the prayer?

LITERACY





Over the next two weeks the students will be learning to identify and create direct speech in a known text. They will be learning to complete sentences containing the conjunctions 'since' and 'although'. They will also finish sentences when given a sentence stem starting with 'before', 'after', 'if' or 'when'.

They will also be learning to read information on a timeline linking to our Inquiry learning of how technology has changed over time.

The students will continue learning about the features of a narrative.

We will also be exploring texts that enrich the students vocabulary and background knowledge relating to our Inquiry unit.

LITERACY - SPELLING



Each week, the Year 1 and 2 students are divided amongst the Year 1 and 2 teachers for the first 20 minutes of the day so that we can teach the synthetic phonics program in a systematic manner.

These are the concepts that we will be covering over the next two weeks. There are practise tasks at the bottom if you would like to have a go practising the spelling at home.

MATHEMATICS



Fractions

We are learning that a fraction is part of a whole. We are learning to use fractions to share a collection into equal parts/groups. The students will learn that two halves equals a whole. Be able to show that four quarters equals a whole, eight eighths equals a whole. As well as identify that the denominator tells us how many equal parts the whole has been divided into.

Time (analogue & digital)

We are learning to tell the time to the half hour, quarter past and quarter to. We are learning how time goes by (second, minute, hour, day, week, month, year). We will also be learning about the the features of a clock

INQUIRY



Our focus for this term is on **Technology**. We will begin looking at how it has changed over time. We will focus on how different forms of communication have evolved.

After taking part in a Digital technology Empower Incursion last week the students will continue learning about how to be **safe** when using technology. The students will learn

	about what personal information is such as your name and address and how to keep the personal information safe. We will then move onto looking at 'hardware' and 'software' and the different parts of digital technology.
WELLBEING	Each week, the Year 1 and 2 students are divided amongst the Year 1 and 2 teachers for a Wellbeing lesson. Over the next two weeks the students will be learning about 'Stress management' and how to cope with stress. They will learn different relaxation Techniques.
