#### **School Fees**

If you wish to register your child for a fee-for-service program, then school fees are required to be up-to-date. Please contact the school's accounts department for any queries regarding school fees. Once placements have been finalised, invoices will be sent.

#### **Refund Policy**

As outlined in the Frequently Asked Questions, due to many programs being run by external organisations the fees for these programs are calculated on a cost recovery basis. The school budget cannot meet any shortfall in the funding of an extra-curricular activity due to a student ceasing participation in a program in which they had registered their interest and intent. Fees already paid for an extra-curricular activity may be refunded in full or in part or not at all, dependent on the associated expenses incurred by that activity and the reason for the ceasing of participation by the student. Any payment made to suppliers in advance will not be refundable.



#### **Frequently Asked Questions**

#### Do I have to sign my child up to one of these programs on Monday?

No. These are purely optional. If your child does not sign up then they are able to leave school early on Mondays at 1.20pm.

#### How do I sign my child up to one of these programs?

Each term an email will be sent to parents/guardians that includes information about the program (this document) as well as a link to register online.

#### Are there limits to how many students can be in a program?

Due to many of the programs being run by external organisations, there are limits to how many students can be in a group. These means that students will be allocated to programs on a 'first-in' basis. It is important to register as soon as possible to give your child the best chance of securing their preferred program.

#### Can I sign my child up to more than one program?

Students may register for more than one program as long as there is no clash of the weeks that these programs are running. Students may wish to sign up to a paid program in conjunction with the study room to ensure supervision is provided each week.

The program that my child is doing only runs for part of the term, what can they do for the other weeks? If the program your child is registered to only goes for part of the term, you may register your child for the Study Room for the alternative weeks.

#### What happens if my child is away one week for one of the paid programs? Do I get a refund?

Due to many programs being run by external organisations, the school is required to confirm numbers prior to the program beginning. Due to this, once your child is allocated to a program, parents/guardians will be invoiced for the whole program. We are unfortunately unable to offer refunds once your child has been allocated to a program.

#### Do I need to contact the school if my child is going to be away?

Yes. Please use the same process for normal absences and indicate in your communication which Time4 activity they will be away for.
