DEVINE INTERVENTION BANKS THIRDS WIN AS RESERVES AND LEAGUE GO DOWN AT HOME.

Long time teammates [Warren Bank](#) and [Paul Devine](#), guided SNESA to a two goal win against 2nd on the ladder Piara Waters in E3 yesterday.

The saints faced drama earlier in the day with both premier ruckmen in Gielingh and Caughey ruled out. Trent Smith was asked to do the bulk of the rucking and he did not shy away. His hitouts giving the likes of [Edwards](#), Saito and [Stott](#) first use of the football.

The saints got on the board early with cheeky around the corner pass from Devine finding Falcetta in the pocket. The both combined for another two goals, giving the saints a slender lead at quarter time.

The second quarter was much like the first, the saints getting away earlier before being reeled back in by the Falcons who took a one goal lead into the main break.

At half and three quarter time the call was not to panic, as the Falcons continued to surge forward with their key forward out marking the SNESA backmen. [Kelly](#) found it difficult at full back but his [McBride](#)smaid gave him plenty of run and support off halfback.

Devine and Bank continued to steady the ship for the saints, one of Bank's goals kicked from 55m against an increasingly strengthening wind. The falcons took a three goal lead into the final change.

With finals on the line, the saints had no option but to get that ball forward as they turned for home with the wind at their back. With Bank and Devine receiving increased attention, Kassem crumbed perfectly to give the saints the first goal of the final quarter. Further goals to Falcetta and Bank levelled the scores. A snap in the pocket to Devine caused controversy, but goal umpire never in doubt as the saints took the lead.

After three quarters of average efforts from him, the highlight of the fourth quarter belonged to Kassem. The Bachar Houli aspirer, marked strongly in the center square, avoided instruction to go long and ignored the self-imposed board runner's calls to be dragged, to go back, set sail for home from 70m out, and yelled out an emotional Bachar W Akbar, sealing a two goal win, pushing the saints up to fifth on the E3 ladder.

Earlier that day, the reserve and league teams hosted Jandakot in crucial top five clashes. The fourth placed reserves matched it with the fifth placed Jets in the first half.

Lennon Butler having a standout first half, beginning to impose his size, skill, presence and value on the field.

Veterans Baptist and Cal Butler also displayed measured and experienced support and run.

The second half, however, was all Jandakot, the jets setting away to an eventual five goal victory.

The SNESA league had its work cut out coming up against the C3 ladder leaders. The pressure was on from the start, and the saints seemed up to the challenge. Swapping one injured skipper for another, Caius Kelly returned for a solid hitout, as Mark Colace watched from the sidelines.

A lot of important players returning to some much needed form. Jesse Abbott returned from a few weeks off, while Evans managed to fill the hole down back. A strong return to form Daniel Williams showed just how important he is to this SNESA outfit, kicking three goals and gathering 35 touches in an outstanding display.

But it was simply not good enough in some patches. The jets made the saints pay at every opportunity, running out 11 point winners.

Next week, the reserves and league will travel to Secret Harbour in another pair of ladder position defining matches. A win for league will keep alive their chance at a home final, while a win for reserves will give them a shot at a double chance.

It doesn't get any easier for the Thirds team, hosting ladder leaders Carlisle at home, in what is sure to be touted as game of the round for E3.
