Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I must drink you shall drink, and with the baptism with which I must be baptised you shall be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.'

When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with James and John, so Jesus called them to him and said to them: 'You know that among the pagans their so-called rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt. This is not to happen among you. No; anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all. For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.'

WWCC Requirement for Volunteers in a Parish

All volunteers over the age of 18 are required to maintain a current WWCC throughout their involvement in parishes. It is a requirement that volunteers who do not have a current WWCC apply for a one. The application process for a WWCC can be commenced online and finalised at a participating Australia Post Office.

A volunteer check is only valid for volunteer work and is free. It is an offence to engage in paid child-related work with a volunteer check. A WWCC is valid for 5 years. Volunteers are responsible for maintaining a valid and current WWCC

Safeguarding Essentials online training module

'Safeguarding Essentials' is a 30-60 minute online training module for all clergy, parish staff and volunteers within the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne. This accessible and engaging online resource provides clergy, parish staff and volunteers with foundational knowledge in relation to safeguarding children, young people and vulnerable persons from abuse and harm.

Volunteers will be required to complete the training every 3 years.

The Safeguarding Children and Young People <u>Code of Conduct</u> has now been embedded into the training module dashboard to be read and signed by each individual. The frequency with which volunteers are required to sign the Safeguarding Children and Young People Code of Conduct has now been aligned with the renewal timeframe for the Safeguarding Essentials online training module, as noted above.

The previous information is from the Archdiocese of Melbourne Website. All parishes are bound to follow these requirements.

This is a reminder to all parishioners who volunteer in any ministry, to have a current WWCC and now to please sign the new Code of Conduct which will last from 2025-2027. The Code of Conduct document will be emailed to all parishioners who receive the Parish Newssheet via email for their information, and if you volunteer please sign the second last page and return it to the parish. If you do not receive the newssheet via email, details about the Code of Conduct are on the Parish Website.

The Archdiocese requires parishes to remove any volunteers in ministries who do not have a WWCC.

REFLECTION by Greg Sunter

Leadership in the Jesus model is about being of service to others; it is not about prestige and acclamation. Many of the best leaders are those who do not have any title of leadership or authori-



ty. Their leadership and authority come from what they do and how they do it. They inspire others to follow their example. They don't demand it; they don't bully; they don't play power games. People simply want to follow their example.

Living the Gospel - Servant Leadership

What does it really mean to practise servant leadership?

It means placing the needs of others before your own desires for prestige or authority. We've all known people who have been given a position of leadership and they really only wanted the job as recognition of their popularity; a thank you for previous work done; an opportunity to demonstrate their strength of will or cleverness with words. Servant leadership is about collaborating; it's about empowering people to do their best; it's about trusting others and about rolling up your sleeves and getting on with the job.

Have you thought? Integrity

Who do you really admire? Who would you really like to be like? Aside from sports stars, models and actors whose particular skills you might admire or even envy; who is a person who lives their life in a way that you would like to emulate? Perhaps it's not that you want to do exactly what they have done but rather it's the way they've gone about living their life. I would bet that there is a close match between what they hold to be true and the way they live their life – integrity!
