RMIT University – Updates



Interested in aviation? RMIT University will expand its flight training school to Bendigo this year, giving more students the opportunity to become fully-qualified, industry-ready pilots. Training routes will include regional and rural airstrips including Swan Hill, Mildura, Shepparton, Horsham and the Riverina in NSW.

There's even more good news for aspiring pilots with the lifetime loan limit available to aviation students increasing from \$104,440 to \$150,000. Learn about sports and societies you can join and be active in

Get course counselling and guidance

Listen to bands, eat lots of food, participate in activities and have fun!

Don't just pick a course at an institution without visiting the campus – you potentially will be spending several years studying there and spending tens of thousands of dollars on your course and accommodation. It's worth making the effort.
