






Mr John Clery's Address

- Please understand the importance of having students here at school on time and (as much as possible) leave appointments for outside school hours. (8.45am-2.55pm)
- With before school care now available to parents through Esteem Kids and with a duty of care to staff and students, from Week 6 onwards, St Nicholas School gates will not be open until the arrival of the first school bus at approximately 8.10am. It is not appropriate for children to be at school before this time.
- School Uniform- Sports Uniform worn 3 days Monday, Wednesday, Friday by all grades. Please ensure children have correct socks, jewellery (1 signet ring, plain studs, medical bracelet), no nail polish, green hair ribbons/bows or school fabric scrunchie only.
 - Please notify the school if your child is absent. This can be done using the 'Add Attendance Note' function in the Compass Parent Portal. Due to government legislation, notification of your child's absence must be received no later than 7 days after your child's last day of absence. If you haven't received an email about creating a Parent Compass account please phone the office and we'll have one emailed out to you.

- Crunch and Sip This is a quick fruit snack. We only allow fresh fruit or veggies at this time (no 'Roll Ups', yoghurt or tinned fruit). Children manage best if the fruit is cut up into small portions eg half an apple, is managed best for this break.
- **First Break: Lunch -** This is a break where the children eat their big meal. They are encouraged to take home what they haven't eaten so you are aware of what they are eating throughout the day. We encourage only water in drink bottles. Please also remember that St Nicholas is a 'Nut Free School', so please do not send any nut products (including spreads on sandwiches). **Lunch orders-** now ordered and paid through the app, **Qkr**. Lunch orders are given out at first break.
- Second Break: Snack Small snack. Canteen available for snack items at this time.

BIRTHDAYS

- We love to celebrate birthdays in Kindergarten.
- Cupcakes or icy poles are preferred for convenience. Each class has 29 students (and 4 beautiful teachers) to share with.

LIBRARY DAY IS THURSDAY

SPORTS UNIFORMS ARE WORN MONDAY, WEDNESDAY AND FRIDAY

PLT - PROFESSIONAL LEARNING TEAM - This is release from face-to-face teaching every two weeks on a Wednesday. Each class has the same release teacher who will teach the classes.



Assessment Day - Each week we will be released for a small portion of the day to assess students.

Home Routine

Every Kindergarten child's bag must have a home routine bag tag (which has been given to complete at the beginning of the year). It is extremely important that you discuss with your child how they will be going home each day. This reduces anxiety throughout the day, helps with organisation in the afternoon and also reduces the office ladies time being spent chasing home procedures.



Home Routine

The options are:

- Car pick up (parents stay in your car and have a large sign with your child's surname. This is also not the place to come to the Hall on foot and skip the queue).
- Footpath pick up (Hill St gate)
- Crossers and Walkers (Please wait on the other side of crossing)
- **Bus** (tag labelled with corect bus name)
- Esteem- at school

 Each child has been assigned a "Buddy" from a Year 6 class.


 These Buddies will become a special companion and offer support throughout the year to your child. We have 'Buddy Visits' several times a term for craft, reading, writing and P.E activities.



Things to note

After-school restraint collapse is real and it might have you feeling like a screaming monster has jumped off the school bus - but look closer. It is a result of students juggling endless expectations in a complex environment all day and they just reached their safe place.

What can you do? Find a way for you child to decompress at the end of the day, whether it's riding a bike, a tickle fight, telling jokes, listening to music or simply doing nothing. This daily decompression activity can become a ritual, and help both you and your child make your way through the intense emotions.

Fine Motor Development

These skills are INCREDIBLY important for many simple tasks in daily life.

By the time a child is 5-6, it is expected that they should be able to cut simple shapes and cut/glue correctly. They should be holding their pencil correctly and colouring within the lines. It is expected that they can draw basic pictures and copy triangles.

WHAT CAN YOU DO...

Cut up paper and cardboard. Fold paper, scrunch paper.

Pegs, tongs, play doh.

Lego building.

Lacing and beading.



REMEMBER



draw it for me... cut it for me...

paste it for me...

put it together for me...

All I learn is that:

You do it better than me.

ORAL LANGUAGE VERBAL IS VITAL!

Remember that parents and guardians are the chief resources in language development. Children learn much from each other, but adults are the main conversationalists, questioners, listeners, responders, and sustainers of language development and growth.

What can you do to promote oral language?

PUT AWAY DEVICES! Play eye spy in the car, cook together, read together, play board games, chat during dinner, make up stories together, retell favourite stories, play talking memory games such as 'I went to the zoo...' etc



As with learning to walk, learning to talk requires time for development and practice in everyday situations.

REMEMBER - Constant correction of a child's speech is usually unproductive.
