Top left: 'The little Ninjas' group taught the students basic 'martial arts moves' through a range of different drills including footwork/ punching/ kicking for safety and self-defence, as well as encouraging team building and exercises with partner work etc. Students also had a chance to perform their newly learnt skills in front of the whole group one on one with the instructors.
