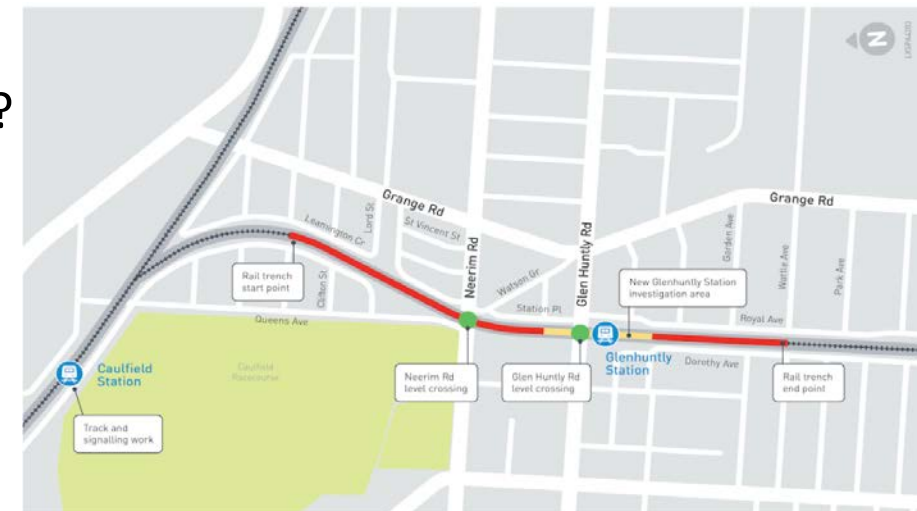
Some questions for GEC staff and families include
