# Inquiry / Integrated Unit for Term 3

This term in our inquiry unit, 'Friends or Foes', we will explore the relationship between animals and plants and determine if they are friends or foes! We'll find out how living things have life cycles and depend on each other and the environment to survive. When you think of a bee, you may think about how a bee could sting you! But bees are absolutely VITAL for our survival. You will find out how insects as small as the bee and ant, play such a critical role in the world's ecosystem and the survival of mankind. There will be an inquiry project that will have a component of home research and project work. A wetland excursion to Latrobe is planned for this unit later in the term.
