Early Entry Program – 2025 Entry

A different way to enter university that will not depend on your ATAR.

The [Early Entry Program | Swinburne](#) is a unique opportunity for current Year 12 students (domestic and onshore International) to receive a conditional offer based on a recommendation by the school, and not based on an ATAR.

Applications are open, and will close later in Term 3. Successful students will receive a conditional offer and the offer will become unconditional should students complete Year 12 and meet the course prerequisites – particularly English (study score of 25) or EAL (study score of 30).

Details of the application process, as well as participating courses can be found below.

1. Application process

Students must organise a recommendation from a school representative – the school’s principal, the year level coordinator, Head of House, or Career Practitioner – in order to proceed with an application.

2. Eligible courses

Courses that will be offered through this program can be found at [Eligible Courses](#), and students can only apply for one course.

Students will be required to complete 3 questions in a *Next Gen Now* questionnaire, and students will be asked to provide a 200-word statement per question.

3. Recommendation form

Once an application is submitted, students will receive a confirmation email which will include the form they need to forward onto their chosen school representative, who will complete the form and return it to Swinburne, who will match it with the student’s application.

Students must also make a VTAC application.



Aspire Community Contribution Program

Open to domestic and international students

Requirements: Year 12 pass, VCE minimum prerequisite study scores and ATAR required

At La Trobe, we believe there is more to being a good student than marks alone.

The [Community Contribution, Aspire Early Entry Program](#) rewards the skills and knowledge students gain from the positive impact they have made on their school or community through **community service, leadership, or volunteering**.

Successful applicants also receive their **early conditional offer** late September or early October for their chosen course along with minimum ATAR requirements. Many courses have a minimum ATAR of 55.00, but some professional degree programs have higher requirements.

Up to 40 [Aspire scholarships](#), worth \$5,000 per year for up to four years, will be awarded to leading eligible Aspire students.

The [Aspire ATAR Table](#) shows the minimum ATAR for some degree courses for entry through Aspire in 2025. Should an applicant’s preferred course not be listed on this table, then the minimum ATAR is 50.00.

Applicants are required to provide information about the length and frequency of their community service and/or volunteering experience.

Types of volunteering include –

- fundraising for charity
- helping to run a school or community club

- coaching a sports team
- volunteering at a nursing home
- mentoring younger students
- leading as a school or house captain

Applications are open and close 6 September 2024. Further details can be found at [Community Contribution, Study with us, Aspire Early Admissions Program, La Trobe University](#). Students will also need to make a VTAC application.



New Public Health and Epidemiology Major in Biomedicine

The Bachelor of Biomedicine has introduced a *new* major in 2024 called '[Public Health and Epidemiology](#)' which can be credited towards the Master of Public Health at the University of Melbourne.

Students will contribute to a real-life health promotion campaign and work to benefit the health of university students. The public health major is highly relevant for students pursuing careers as health professionals, as it provides an understanding of the many factors that impact an individual's health. Students will also develop skills essential for health professional practice, such as communication, ethical health practice, and interpretation of data.

One particular difference between a business degree and a commerce degree is often the VCE maths prerequisite entry requirement, where Maths Methods is the preferred maths.

Career in Health Information Management

According to the [Health Information Management Association of Australia \(HIMAA\)](#) *health information management professionals contribute to health outcomes and the healthcare system through best practice health information management.*

Health information management professionals work in a variety of roles in all areas of the healthcare system.

While many people work in health information related roles, there are **two specialist** occupations for health information management professionals:

1. Health Information Managers (HIMs)

Health Information Managers plan, develop and manage health information systems for patient, clinical and administrative data necessary for patient care, healthcare planning and funding. They play a key role in the secure, confidential, and legal use of patient information. Health Information Managers are degree qualified through a HIMAA accredited or recognised course.

2. Clinical Coders

Clinical Coders are responsible for translating clinical information gathered during a patient's hospital stay into codes according to a recognised health classification system. Clinical coding information is utilised for planning, resourcing, benchmarking and funding purposes at local, regional and national level. Clinical Coders are either qualified HIMs or are qualified through a VET course accredited by the Australian Skills Quality Authority (ASQA).

In Victoria, La Trobe University offers a HIMAA- accredited [Bachelor of Health Information Management](#).

Students keen on studying to be a Clinical Coder can study the [Diploma of Clinical Coding](#) at Victoria University, or the diploma offered by the HIMAA itself - [Diploma of Clinical Coding](#).
