Home Learning

What We Are Learning In...

Reading

Use comprehension strategies to build literal and inferred meaning to expand content knowledge, integrating and linking ideas and analysing and evaluating texts.

Identify features used in persuasive texts to meet the purpose of the text.

Understand how texts vary in complexity and technicality depending on the approach to the topic, the purpose and the intended audience.

Understand that social interactions influence the way people engage with ideas and respond to others.

Writing

Plan, draft and publish persuasive texts containing key information and supporting details for a widening range of audiences.

Write a biography about a scientist, including key facts, events and achievements that give insight into their life and contributions.

Reread and edit for meaning by adding, deleting or moving words or word groups to improve content and structure.

Incorporate new vocabulary from a range of sources.

Spelling patterns

- using phonological (sound) knowledge
- using visual knowledge

Writing using clearly formed joined letters with increased fluency.

Maths

Use scaled instruments to measure and compare masses and capacities.

Select and trial methods for data collection, including survey questions and recording sheets.

Construct suitable data displays include tables, column graphs and picture graphs.

Compare 2D shapes and 3D objects.

Describe possible everyday events and the possible outcomes of chance experiments.

Inquiry Learning

This term, students will explore the question, 'Why don't all living things grow and change in the same way?' through the Science curriculum. They will make observations through Scientific Inquiry to develop explanations of natural circumstances. Students will also learn about the different life cycles of animals and plants.

Students will observe that plants and animals have observable features that can be used to group them in different ways.

Religion

To begin this term in Religious Education, we will explore the theme of Stewardship of Creation. Students will learn what it means to take care of God's creation and consider practical ways we can show respect and responsibility for the world around us.

Students will learn about the sacrament of Reconciliation. They will reflect on the importance of forgiveness in their own lives and explore how Jesus teaches us to forgive others and seek forgiveness when we make mistakes.

Finally, as we move close to Christmas the focus will move to the Christmas narrative.

Social Emotional Learning

Our whole school value for the term is Optimism. Students will learn to approach challenges with a positive mindset and see possibilities rather than obstacles.
