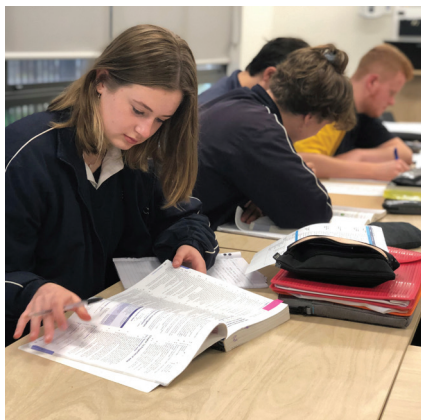
Honour certificates
