Mathematics and Statistics Research Competition

The University of Melbourne School of Mathematics and Statistics Research Competition provides school-aged students with the opportunity to understand what it means to conduct mathematics and solve mathematical problems.

Students will be given a set of open-ended research questions from which they choose one. They can then employ methods used by mathematical researchers to investigate their problem; they can gather data, simplify, visualise, hypothesise, conjecture and prove.

The aim of the competition is to allow students to use their creativity and problem-solving skills to make choices about how best to ask and answer questions about their chosen project.

As teamwork is a valuable and essential skill for research, students are encouraged to participate in the competition as part of a team which will provide opportunities to reason and work collaboratively with others. Students may participate individually if they wish.

Students must be enrolled in an Australian or New Zealand government or non-government school. The competition is open to three age categories:

- Senior (AU: Year 10 12, NZ: Year 11-13),
- Intermediate (AU: Year 7-9, NZ: Year 8-10) and
- Juniors (AU: Year 5 6, NZ: Year 6-7).

The top team from each category will win \$1500. Submissions close 10 August 2022.

What is a Commonwealth Supported Place?

If you're looking at uni courses, one of the terms you've probably come across is Commonwealth Supported Place (or CSP). But what actually is a CSP, and what does it mean for you?

What are CSPs?

Every degree at every uni has a set amount of students they can let in. These are known as places. For a lot of degrees, places are uncapped (meaning anyone who applies and meets the requirements will get a place). For some, particularly things like medicine and nursing, places are capped to a certain number. A **Commonwealth Supported Place** is just a certain type of place. If you are offered a CSP, it means that the government will subsidise some of the cost of your degree. This means it's cheaper for you to go to uni (great, right?).

Whatever amount is left over after the government subsidy is known as your **Student Contribution**. You can either pay this amount upfront, or more commonly, defer it to a <u>HECS-HELP loan</u>.

How do I know if I'm eligible for a CSP?

Generally, **any domestic student applying for an undergraduate course in Australia** is eligible for a CSP. All you need is a <u>Unique Student Identifier</u> (USI).

International students are **not** eligible for CSPs. Many postgraduate courses also do **not** offer CSPs. If you're not eligible for a CSP, you will need to pay the full course fee. You can still defer this to a loan known as <u>FEE-HELP</u>.

How do I know if a course offers CSPs?

You can see if a course offers CSPs by looking at the details on the university's website, through a <u>TAC</u>, or on <u>Course Seeker</u>. For example, if we look at the <u>Bachelor of Business</u> from CQUni, we can see that they only offer CSPs to domestic students.

There isn't anything special you need to do to apply for a CSP – just apply through a TAC or direct to the uni like you usually would.

As a general rule, **almost all** universities in Australia will offer CSPs to domestic students studying undergraduate courses. But be sure to carefully check the fee information on your chosen course to make sure.

Job Spotlight

How to become an Early Childhood Educator

Early Childhood Educators are responsible for teaching and caring for children under school age. They teach kids basic literacy and numeracy skills, as well as engaging them with various activities including arts, sports, music, and more. They also facilitate social interactions and care for a child's emotional wellbeing.

If you love kids, can handle a job that can be unpredictable and challenging, and are caring and kind, this could be the perfect job for you.

About you:

- Caring and patient
- Excellent communicator
- Adaptable and flexible
- Emotionally resilient
- Works great with kids
- Thrives under pressure
- Can work in teams and alone

The job:

- Supervising children while they play and learn
- Planning lessons appropriate to a child's developmental level
- Teaching children basic numeracy and literacy skills
- Engaging children in appropriate learning and recreational activities
- Observing children for signs of any unusual behaviour
- Meeting with parents and carers and discussing development
- Working in collaboration with other Childcare Workers and Teachers

Lifestyle Impact: Low

- Part Time opportunities: High around 44% of Early Childhood Educators work part-time (source: labourmarketinsights.gov.au).
- Average hours for full-time workers: 42 hours a week, which is average (source: labourmarketinsights.gov.au).
- Early Childhood Educators' salary (average) \$70,000* per year (source: seek.com.au). *Salaries vary depending on your skills and experience.

- Future career growth: Very strong (source: labourmarketinsights.gov.au).
- You will be doing some of your work indoors, in settings such as childcare centres, kindergartens, and schools. You will also need to supervise children while they learn and play outside.
- Around a third of workers reported that they regularly work overtime or extra hours (source: labourmarketinsights.gov.au).

Early Childhood Educators are most in demand in these locations:

This is a large occupation, with only around 47,900 people working as Early Childhood Educators in Australia in 2020 (source: labourmarketinsights.gov.au). Demand for Early Childhood Educators is highest in New South Wales and South Australia. Most Early Childhood Educators work in the Education and Training industry.

How to become an Early Childhood Educator in Australia

To work as an Early Childhood Educator, you will need at minimum an undergraduate qualification in teaching or education.

Step 1 - Complete Year 12 with a focus on English and Maths.

Step 2 – Complete a relevant undergraduate degree. This will most likely be a <u>Bachelor of Teaching or</u> <u>Education</u> majoring in Early Childhood.

Step 3 – You will also need to hold a Working with Children Check. You may be required to complete a certain number of hours of placements or practicals.

Step 4 – Lodge an application to register as a Teacher in your state or territory.

Step 5 – Start working as an Early Childhood Educator.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

What do Early Childhood Educators do?

Meteorologists are responsible for predicting and tracking weather events and systems of all kinds, including rain and thunderstorms, cyclones, tornadoes, fires, extreme winds, and more.

What options are there for career progression?

Once you have some experience, you might like to specialise in teaching children with special needs, or developing education programs for other Teachers and Educators. You might even like to upskill one day and become a Primary or Secondary Teacher.

Do I need to go to university to become an Early Childhood Educator?

Yes, you will need a university-level qualification, as well as registering through your state or territory's relevant board.

Where do Early Childhood Educators work?

Early Childhood Educators work in a variety of settings, including preschools, kindergartens, day care centres, and schools.

What are 3 things I can do right now to help me become an Early Childhood Educator?

If you're in high school and you'd like to find out if a career as an Early Childhood Educator is right for you, here's a few things you could do right now:

- 1. Volunteer or find part-time work with children, such as babysitting, tutoring, or even working at a day care centre.
- 2. See if you can find work experience in an education-related setting. This will help you see if you might enjoy the work, and can help you start building important contacts for the future.
- 3. Talk to an Early Childhood Educator to see what a day in their life is like. If you don't know anyone, see if you can watch videos or documentaries about a career in education.
