Assessment and Reporting

As we are approaching the mid-point of Term 2, our teachers are busy planning for assessment and reporting. We will be providing further information about our Term 2 Reporting next week – as we know you will appreciate, it is going to look rather different this term. We will still be providing as much information as possible about the progress your child has made. To support this, many of the tasks your child completes on Google Classroom will be used to help gauge their progress. Here are some top tips for supporting your child's work, whilst ensuring that our teachers gain an accurate view of their understanding:

- Encourage your child to complete tasks independently.
- Support your child to reach out to their teacher or peers via Google Classroom stream or private message, if they are stuck with a task. This will help the teachers understand what your child needed help with.
- Communicate any particular difficulties that your child had with a task, or if the task was completed with significant help from you.
- Encourage your child to share their mistakes with their teacher and definitely don't erase them they are the best way to learn, and give our teachers a lot of information about your child's understanding.
- Celebrate all of their achievements with them!

We are all looking forward to seeing our students and families as we transition back to school over the coming weeks. We hope you continue to stay safe and well until then.
