

Dear Parents,

On **Friday the 29th of July**, the Mini Mission Fete will be hosted by the Year 5 and 6's. Year 4 students are hosting the Cake Stall - '*Cakes for a Cause'*. There will be only individually wrapped treats available with the ingredients clear. Throughout the end of Term 2 and the start of Term 3, the students put lots of work into researching and choosing a charity that they would like to donate to. The charities chosen are called 'The Black Dog Institute' and The St John's Card Making Group who are raising money to support Ukrainian refugees. The money raised will help young people who need assistance with their own wellbeing and mental health as well as refugees who have been forced to leave their homes in the Ukraine and take refuge in different countries.

The Mini Mission Fete has become a St James tradition, deliberately held near our Feast Day as an opportunity to put into action our call to look after others.

We have organised several stalls that all have different activities for the students to enjoy. The pricing ranges from 10c cents to \$4. These stalls include various sporting activities, art and games stalls, and food and drink stalls. There will be raffles and small prizes given at some stalls. Each student will only be able to choose a maximum of 2 food and drink items throughout the day. Don't forget to check out the stalls, via the video link in the newsletter.

There will be a sausage sizzle on the day and the students have been sent home a form for ordering the sausages that should be returned by **Tuesday the 26th of July.** The sausages will be given out prior to and during the fete. Each Year Level will be called up one at a time.

The Mini Mission Fete will run from 11:00 am to 1:00 pm.

We ask students to bring along a named wallet or purse with money. It is recommended that students bring along between \$5 and \$10 (coins would be ideal).

Students may like to do some extra chores to earn some extra pocket money to spend.

Students are asked to wear **free dress** on Friday for a 50c donation. These coins can be given to their classroom teacher when students arrive at school in the morning and will help form the float for our stalls.

We would love to have parents attend and Mr Mutimer will make a decision about that later in the week depending on our St James COVID situation.
