Studying Marine Science at Deakin University

➤ [Bachelor of Sport Business](#)

The Bachelor of Sport Business is designed to give students the essential skills and knowledge needed in the competitive sports industry. The degree prepares students for real-world challenges, ensuring they learn valuable skills to achieve their career goals in the sports industry. Holmesglen's academic staff brings extensive expertise in *business, management, marketing, sponsorship, venue management, government, and media*.

The Bachelor of Sports Media has been designed to nurture students that aspire to work in the sports media industry. The course has four streams: *sport, media, journalism, and communications*. Graduates of this course will be equipped to work in a variety of roles with sports leagues and clubs, sports media organisations, media organisations and sports agencies.

In the third year of the degree students are required to undertake a 228-hour (six-week full-time equivalent) internship which provides experience that assists with a seamless transition into the workforce upon fulfilling the course requirements.

Snapshot of The University of Otago (New Zealand) in 2025

- Founded in 1869, the University of Otago is the oldest university in New Zealand.
- Students join a diverse population of well over 20,000 students from around New Zealand and more than 100 nations around the world.

- The Health Sciences First Year (HSFY) is the essential first step into Otago's health professional programmes, and also an excellent way to begin a degree in biological or biomedical sciences. This foundation year leads into five professional programmes: **dentistry, medical laboratory science, medicine, pharmacy, and physiotherapy**. It is also an excellent way to begin a degree in biomedical science or any of the broad range of biological sciences at Otago - [Health Sciences First Year \(HSFY\)](#).
- The University has 14 well-appointed and friendly residential colleges - [Residential Colleges](#).
- Australian citizens and permanent residents pay the same fees as New Zealand citizens if they are studying in New Zealand. If they are studying distance learning papers from outside of New Zealand, they will need to pay international fees. They are also not eligible to apply for the New Zealand Student Loan or Allowance unless they have been living in New Zealand for at least three years and are normally living in New Zealand.
