Celebrating 150 Years of Ceres Primary School

Our celebrations of Ceres Primary School's 150th year continue into Term 3. This has been a special opportunity for students to explore the school's history and deepen their understanding of our community's past. If you or someone you know has any historical stories, artefacts or photographs from our school's past, we would love to hear from you.

Morning Routine & Independence

Developing strong routines continues to be a focus this term. Students may enter the school from 8:35am to begin setting up for the day, with classroom doors open from 8:35–8:45am. This is a great opportunity for students to build independence by unpacking their bags, completing morning jobs, and preparing for the day ahead. We kindly encourage parents to support this by saying goodbye at the door or bus shelter, unless other arrangements have been discussed with your child's teacher.

Assembly – Come Along!

Our school assemblies take place every second Friday at 2:30pm. Families are always welcome to attend. These are wonderful moments to see what our students have been learning and celebrate their achievements. In addition to student shares and updates from our classes, awards like the Principal's Award, GEM Award (Resilience Project), Stretch the Brain, and Aussie of the Month are presented. You'll be notified if your child is receiving an award—we'd love to see you there!

English – Building Strong Foundations in Literacy

This term, our 2-hour English blocks continue to provide students with a rich and comprehensive literacy experience. Students participate in a structured routine that includes:

- Daily Reviews
- Phonics and Spelling
- Fluency and Handwriting
- Vocabulary and Comprehension Strategies
- Purposeful and structured Writing tasks

In Term 3, we will focus heavily on **narrative and informative writing**, learning how to organise ideas, use descriptive language, and engage the reader with interesting vocabulary and structure. We are reading the text *Matilda by Roald Dahl'*, as well as studying 'Off We Go Around Australia' and 'The Iron Giant'. Students will also work on **reading comprehension**, exploring texts to infer, make connections, and understand author intent.

Home reading continues to be a key part of supporting your child's growth. Please encourage daily reading and the use of their **Resilience Project reading logs**, which also provide a space for reflecting on Gratitude, Empathy and Mindfulness (GEM). Certificates are awarded as students reach milestones—keep up the amazing reading at home!

Mathematics – Exploring Concepts and Building Confidence

Our Term 3 Maths focus will include:

- Patterns, Algebra and Operations
- Fractions
- Measurement & Shape
- Space
- Position and Direction

Students will engage with hands-on learning experiences and real-life applications, such as measuring objects in the classroom and comparing masses of everyday items. We'll also continue to develop mental strategies and problem-solving confidence through our **Launch–Explore–Discuss** model, and challenge students with open-ended and creative tasks.

Students are encouraged to practise recall of number facts and use online tools like **Mathletics Live** and **MyNumeracy**, especially tasks aligned to their individual goals (shared on Seesaw). These reinforce class learning and build confidence with core skills.









Inquiry - Biological Science and Living Things

This term, our Inquiry unit shifts to **Biological Science**, where we explore the fascinating world of living things. Students will investigate:

- The **life cycles** of plants and animals
- How living things grow, change, and adapt
- The interconnections between living things and their environment
- What it means to care for and protect native species

As part of our exciting Biological Science unit this term, we're diving into the fascinating world of living things—their life cycles, habitats, and how they interact with their environment. To wrap up our learning, we're currently planning a **special excursion** for the end of Term 3 that will bring this unit to life in a fun, hands-on way. Stay tuned for more details in the coming weeks, and in the meantime, get those thinking caps on—we've got plenty of curious creatures and wild facts to explore!

Our school's **sustainability goals** will link into this unit, including opportunities for students to engage in outdoor learning, plant observations, and nature walks. If families have expertise or interest in native plants, wildlife, or gardening, we'd love to involve you!

Looking Ahead to Term 4

To finish the year, our Inquiry focus will shift to **Health, Wellbeing and Personal Development**, where students will explore:

- Healthy choices and nutrition
- Physical activity and positive relationships
- Managing emotions and mental wellbeing

This unit will encourage students to reflect on themselves, their habits, and how they can grow as individuals and as a community member.

We're looking forward to an exciting and purposeful Term 3, full of rich learning and growth. Thank you for continuing to support your child's journey—together, we're building strong learners, friends, and thinkers.

Values and Resilience Project

Values lessons are a highlight of our Mondays! Each afternoon, we dive into our exciting new 3 R's: Respect, Resilience, and Responsibility. These engaging sessions complement our Respectful Relationships curriculum, making learning both fun and meaningful!

Additionally we have our Resilience Project lessons, happening every second Thursday (see the timetable below). Each student will be working on their very own 'Resilience Project' journal.

Teachers and students will come together for fun, engaging lessons and activities every two weeks, focusing on the key principles of Gratitude, Empathy, Mindfulness (GEM), and Emotional Literacy to build that all-important resilience!

We use the SeeSaw app to keep you informed about what we do at school. On SeeSaw, we share students' weekly spelling words, their spelling tests, learning tasks, and fun updates on our activities. We invite you to get involved by liking and commenting on student posts, cheering them on for their hard work and achievements. This collaboration helps strengthen the connection between home and school, fostering a supportive learning environment for our students.

ICT & iPads

Please ensure iPads are brought to school everyday, charged and in a protective case. If you have any questions, please contact your child's teacher.

Houses

At Ceres Primary School, we have two houses—Lok Lok Eagles (Yellow) and Kanyul Kangaroos (Green). Students earn tokens for their house by showing our school values, whether in the classroom or out in the yard. Every fortnight at assembly, our house captains share the latest token tally, keeping the competition fun and exciting! Throughout the year, students will take part in house activities like sports, learning challenges, and more. It's a fantastic chance for students to show their house pride, cheer on their friends, and have a great time.

Organisation Reminders
