

Despite economics delivering comprehensive, critical problem solving skills, the total number of students doing economics has gone down. Those who are studying economics are most likely to be boys and a school is three times more likely to offer the subject if it is in a well-off

### **Tips for Getting a Traineeship or Apprenticeship**

These tips are from Rob Palmer, Careers Counsellor at Sout Metro TAFE

**Step 1:** Ask for a work placement with a business while still at school.

Schools will cover your insurance while on work placement/experience. When you leave school, you can get insurance cover from Volunteering WA but the range of volunteering work is limited.

- **Step 2:** Demonstrate what a great employee you are.
- **Step 3:** Get information from a Jobs and Skills Centre on subsidies that employers can get.
- **Step 4:** Tell the potential employer about the subsidies and ask if they will take you on.
- **Step 5**: It they won't take you on, ask if they know of anyone who can take you on.

**Best Practice Career Education for Students with Disability – Creating a National Resource Hub** 



Last year, the National Centre for Student Equity in Higher Education (NCSEHE) funded research to investigate career development provision for students from low socioeconomic (SES) backgrounds. The findings informed the development of a set of Best Practice Principles and practical resources for the provision of career education for this cohort of students. However, an important finding from the project was how the experiences of students with disability (SwD) differed when exploring their post-secondary futures, as well as the lack of targeted careers support for this cohort.

#### **Student Learner Profiles Needed**

In its final report, <u>Looking to the Future</u>, the <u>Review of Senior Secondary Pathways</u> (the "Shergold Review"), called for the creation of learner profiles in Australia:

Students should leave school with a Learner Profile that incorporates not only their ATAR score (where relevant) together with their individual subject results, but that also captures the broader range of evidenced capabilities necessary for employment and active citizenship that they have acquired in senior secondary schooling. (Looking to the Future. Shergold et al., 2020, p. 20).

This feature article addresses some critical issues associated with the learner profile from an equity perspective and poses further questions to help facilitate its development and implementation.

While we focus primarily on higher education, the points raised are broadly applicable to education and careers development among secondary students and wider issues around post-secondary pathways.






#### 9 August Dave Turner: Creating Youth Friendly Pathways






