

# YEAR 12 CHECKLIST FOR APPLYING THROUGH UAC



## RESEARCH AVAILABLE COURSES

There are over 2,500 courses available for 2018–19 admissions via UAC. You can research the courses available by using the *UAC Guide 2018–19*, UAC's website or the My UAC app. Check ATAR information, admission requirements and pathway options for the courses you're interested in. Take note of important dates in the application process.

## KEEP YOUR UAC PIN SAFE

Your UAC Personal Identification Number (PIN) allows you to apply for tertiary study and access information such as your course preferences, offers and ATAR.

If you're a 2018 NSW/ACT HSC student, your four-digit UAC PIN will be emailed to the address you registered with the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA). For all other applicants, your UAC PIN is the first four digits of your date of birth – for example, if your birthday is 17 May, your UAC PIN is 1705.

## APPLY FOR UNI THROUGH UAC

You can apply for up to five courses through UAC's website. Even if you're not sure what you want to study, apply now and change your course preferences later. We recommend you apply before midnight on **Friday 28 September** to avoid an increase in the processing charge.

Remember to make a note of your application number. You'll need this number to log in to your application, to change your preferences, and to check offers.

## CHANGE YOUR UAC PIN

It's a good idea to change your UAC PIN once you've submitted your application. Your new UAC PIN must contain four numeric characters.

## PROVIDE A CURRENT EMAIL

You'll need to provide a current email address when you apply so UAC can let you know about the progress of your application. We recommend you log in regularly to check for messages.

## CHECK YOUR DETAILS ARE CORRECT

The personal details you provided to NESA—including your first, middle and last name—must match your passport or birth certificate. Inform your school of any changes to your name as this information will be transferred to your UAC application.

## APPLY FOR SCHEMES AND SCHOLARSHIPS

### Schools Recommendation Schemes

Schools Recommendation Schemes (SRS) are one way institutions make early offers of undergraduate admission to current Australian Year 12 students, using criteria other than (or in addition to) ATARs. These criteria include school recommendations and senior secondary studies.

SRS applications open on **Wednesday 1 August 2018** and close at midnight on **Friday 28 September 2018**. After this date, you cannot access or modify your SRS application.

### Educational Access Schemes

Educational Access Schemes (EAS) help students who have experienced long-term educational disadvantage gain admission to tertiary study. Apply for EAS as part of your application for uni.

EAS applications open on **Wednesday 1 August 2018** and close on **Friday 8 February 2019**, but we recommend students apply by 23 November 2018.
