St Laurence's 6A 35 def. Marist 6A 0

Marist 6A endured a disappointing morning against St Laurence's College, falling 35-0 in a match where the side struggled to find rhythm and consistency. From the outset, Marist lacked the effort and intensity required against quality opposition, allowing SLC to take control of the contest.

Poor passing and missed tackles repeatedly placed the team under pressure, while too many turnovers in promising field position prevented Marist from building sustained attacking momentum. At times, the attack became predictable, with the forwards reverting to one-out running rather than playing the structured, team-first rugby the side is capable of producing.

To their credit, St Laurence's executed their opportunities well throughout the match. They were clinical when chances presented themselves, defended strongly, and ultimately proved to be the better side on the day.

For Marist, the performance highlighted the importance of returning to the fundamentals. The team must focus on executing the basics consistently and controlling the aspects of the game within their control if they are to respond positively in the coming weeks.

Round 5 presents an important opportunity for the boys to restore some pride when they face Villanova, following another disappointing result against the same opposition earlier in the season.
