### Reflection: Pentecost Sunday

Jerusalem, tragically, is one of the most contested cities on the face of the earth. In Jesus' day it was a lightning rod for the tension between Roman might and Jewish believers. Nowadays the conflict is between the state of Israel and the Palestinian people. But as a holy city revered by Jews, Christians and Moslems alike, it could have been so much more - a symbol of the fundamental unity of humankind, diverse in faith and one in peace.

That unity was manifest on the day of Pentecost when Jews from many foreign lands heard the good news in their own language. And it's what we sometimes catch a glimpse of in this multi-cultural multi-faith nation of Australia, once called the great south land of the Holy Spirit and always one under the Southern Cross. In the lead-up to the Plenary Council, we Catholic believers are being asked to discern what the Spirit is asking of us as church. What kind of church can we be and for what kind of Australia? As we dream of the possibilities and face the obstacles, today is a good day to pray again:

Come, Holy Spirit of Pentecost. Come, Holy Spirit of the great South Land.

O God, bless and unite all your people in Australia and guide us on the pilgrim way of the Plenary Council. Give us the grace to see your face in one another and to recognise Jesus, our companion on the road. Give us the courage to tell our stories and to speak boldly of your truth. Give us ears to listen humbly to each other and a discerning heart to hear what you are saying. Lead your Church into a hope-filled future, that we may live the joy of the Gospel. Through Jesus Christ our Lord, bread for the journey from age to age. Amen.

### Domenica di Pentecoste, 23 maggio 2021

Gerusalemme, tragicamente, è una delle città più contese sulla faccia della terra. Ai giorni di Gesù era un parafulmine per la tensione tra la potenza romana e i credenti ebrei. Al giorno d'oggi il conflitto è tra lo stato di Israele e il popolo palestinese. Ma in quanto città santa venerata da ebrei, cristiani e musulmani, avrebbe potuto essere molto di più: un simbolo dell'unità fondamentale dell'umanità, diversa nella fede e una nella pace.

Quell'unità si manifestò il giorno di Pentecoste, quando gli ebrei di molti paesi stranieri udirono la buona notizia nella loro lingua. Ed è quello che a volte scorgiamo in questa nazione multiculturale e multi-religiosa dell'Australia, una volta chiamata la grande terra meridionale dello Spirito Santo e sempre sotto la Croce del Sud. In vista del Consiglio Plenario, a noi credenti cattolici viene chiesto di discernere ciò che lo Spirito chiede da noi come Chiesa. Che tipo di Chiesa possiamo essere e per quale tipo di Australia? Mentre sogniamo le possibilità e affrontiamo gli ostacoli, oggi è un buon giorno per pregare di nuovo:

Vieni, Santo Spirito di Pentecoste. Vieni, Spirito Santo della grande Terra del Sud.

O Dio, benedici e unisci tutto il tuo popolo in Australia e guidaci sul cammino di pellegrinaggio del Consiglio Plenario. Dacci la grazia di vedere il tuo volto l'uno nell'altro e riconoscere Gesù, nostro compagno di strada. Dacci il coraggio di raccontare le nostre storie e di parlare con franchezza della tua verità. Dacci orecchie per ascoltarci umilmente e un cuore perspicace per ascoltare quello che dici. Guida la tua Chiesa in un futuro pieno di speranza, affinché possiamo vivere la gioia del Vangelo. Per Gesù Cristo nostro Signore, pane per il viaggio attraverso i secoli. Amen.

**First Reading** Apostles 2:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose.

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.
