NEW MEMBERS are ALWAYS WELCOME

The Committee meet on the third Wednesday of each month at 7pm at the RT White Raceway, Blake St Ararat. The Show Committee would welcome any new ideas and assistance with our annual show.

Rules & Regulations

- 1. The name, age and breed of any stock, so far as known, mist be supplied to the Secretary with the entry, together with explicit instructions as to class and section for which entry is intended.
- 2. No person will be permitted to exhibit unless his/her membership or entry fee has been paid beforehand. This rule will be strictly adhered to.
- 3. Entry Fees in all sections are stated at the beginning of each section details.
- 4. All exhibits must be arranged in their allocated places by the time stipulated in each class.
- 5. The Committee shall have the power to demand by Statutory Declaration of any entry or particular concerning any entry from any exhibitor. Refusal or failure of any such exhibitor to make such a declaration when called on to do so shall render such exhibitor liable to disqualification from receiving any prize at the Show or from membership for any period. Not withstanding any declaration, the Committee may withhold any prize pending further investigation.
- 6. If in the opinion of the Committee any prizes have been awarded to an exhibit which does not comply with the intention of the prize offered, the Committee may disqualify such exhibit.
- Judges have the power to withhold any prize if they deem the exhibit undeserving.
- 8. Protests may be in writing before 4pm, on the day of the Show, accompanied in each case by a \$50, such fee to be forfeited if the protest is deemed frivolous. Committee of Appeals shall consist of the President, Secretary and Judge and Committee's decision shall be in all cases final.
- 9. Any person making fraudulent or erroneous entries or statements regarding their exhibits, or guilty of offensive conduct, or undue interference with any show official, shall be liable to any penalties mentioned in Rule 10.
- 10. Contravention of any of the regulations published on prize list shall render the person liable to (a) Expulsion from the grounds; (b) Disqualification for any period; (c) Forfeiture of any prize money; (d) if he/she is a member, explosion from the Society according to the pleasure of the Committee.
- 11. Admission to Society's grounds from non-members: Single Adult (16 and over) \$10.00, Children (from 6 Years to 16 Years) \$5.00, Children (Under 5) Free. Family Membership Tickets available prior to Show Day \$25.00.
- 12. Entries Close Friday October 25th except where stated otherwise. The full amount of the entry fee must accompany all entries.
- 13. Special regulations for Sections F, G, Ga, Childrens, H, Hj, I and J. In order to ensure exhibitors the return of their exhibits, duplicate tickets will be issued for all exhibits in these sections.
- 14. Section stewards will hand exhibits to those presenting duplicate tickets.
- 15. Prize Cards; First, Second, Highly Commended.
- 16. Every care will be taken of all exhibits, but the Society accepts no responsibility for the loss or damage to any exhibit.
- 17. The Society will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through or by any exhibit and it shall be a condition of entry that each competitor shall not hold the Society responsible and shall indemnify itself against any legal proceedings from any such accident.
- 18. This schedule has been compiled the best of the Society's knowledge and the Committee will not be responsible for any disputed entries herein.
- 19. No exhibit or person in charge thereof shall be equipped with, wear or display anything which indicates the ownership of the exhibit before and during the judging unless this practice is expressly authorised in the regulations in the relevant prize schedule.
- 20. No water pistols, water bombs, knives, silly string or obnoxious smelling gas or other banned items from the VASL supplied banned items list allowed to be sold or bought into the environs.

NOTE TO EXHIBITORS:

Old ribbons and prize cards must not be shown.

Wimmera Agricultural Societies Association (WASA) - Competitions

- 1. A person having won at a local show level will compete at a Wimmera Group final in November.
- 2. A person having won at a Show level, is not eligible for entry at any other show until after the Group judging when, if not the winning entry, can compete again.
- 3. Each article entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
- 4. If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group Final, then 2nd place-getter is eligible to compete.
- 5. WASA entrants must reside in the boundaries of the Wimmera Group.
- 6. Winners at WASA Group Final receive \$20 cash.
- 7. Items, except cookery exhibits which are entered in the Wimmera final judging must be exactly the same as won at the local show.

Victorian Agricultural Shows Ltd (VASL) – Competitions

- 1. A person can represent only one Society or Group for VASL.
- 2. An article having won at Show level will complete at Group Final, winner will then compete at the next Royal Melbourne Show.
- 3. An article having won Group Final cannot compete further until after the Royal Melbourne Show.
- 4. An article having won at the Royal Melbourne Show in any class is no longer eligible to compete in the competition.
- 5. Each article entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
- 6. If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final level, then 2nd place-getter is eligible to compete.
- 7. Items, except cookery exhibits, must be the same as won at local Show or Group.
- 8. A person will not be permitted to win at more than one Show within the State in any one Show year. Persons not adhering to this rule will be required to forfeit/refund prize money.
- 9. An article, having won first at a Show, cannot be shown at any other State Show that year. All work to have been completed within 12 months.

11. McKenzie's Rich Fruit Cake (WASA) - Ingredients

250g sultanas 250g chopped raisins

125g chopped mixed peel 90g chopped red glazed cherries

1/3 cup sherry or brandy 250g plain flour

½ teaspoon vanilla essence¼ teaspoon grated nutmeg250g butter250g soft brown sugar

½ teaspoon lemon essence or grated lemon rind

250g currants

90g chopped blanched almonds

60g self raising flour

½ teaspoon ground ginger

½ teaspoon almond essence

4 large eggs

Method :

Mix together all the fruit and nuts and sprinkle with sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least an hour but preferably overnight. Sift together flour and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essence. Add eggs on at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternatively add the fruit and the flour mixture. Mix thoroughly, the mix should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place mixture into a prepared 20cm square, straight sided, square corner tin. Bake in a slow oven for approx. 3 ½ - 4 hours. Allow cake to cool in tin. NOTE: To ensure uniformity and amp; depending upon size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2-3 pieces, cherries 4-6 pieces and amp; almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.
