Looking at the Readings

Each first Sunday of Lent we hear the temptations of Christ. This year we have Luke's account which is much more detailed than Mark (B) but similar, slightly longer than Matthew (A). Luke has the Devil tempt Jesus the whole 40 days and finally records the last three temptations, bread to satisfy his hunger, power and glory, and third most complicated one of throwing himself down from the top of the temple. Jesus resisted all temptations but warned that the devil will return.

The Temple is where Luke's gospel commenced with Zechariah receiving the message of his son's birth, the presentation and later finding Jesus among the doctors and concluded with the apostles returning from the mount of the Ascension to Jerusalem and the Temple to give praise to God. It is in Jerusalem that Jesus finally returns. Here the devil enters Judas Iscariot, and Jesus is taunted by soldiers in similar words used by Satan: "If are the Son of God ..." to save himself.

Temptations are real, no one is spared, they come at anytime but we able to overcome them. We look to Christ at this time at the beginning of Lent, a season of prayer, fasting and reconciliation at season to prepare for baptism and the Resurrection.


Prayer for the Week

Lighter Side

This time last year, liturgically speaking, the State of Victoria had a snap "circuit-breaker" lockdown. The churches reopened on the Thursday after Ash Wednesday. I distributed the ashes at Masses and in classrooms for the next three days. I asked each time what day is it? The children replied: "Ash Thursday, Ash Friday, or Ash Sunday, accordingly. The adults, however, retorted: "No, it's not!" Again the young showed their adaptability in time of pandemic.

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Liturgical Jottings Season of Lent I Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are

days of fast and abstinence from meat. The law of fasting binds those who have completed their 18th year until their 60th year. The law of abstinence binds those who have completed their 14th year. (CCL 97, 1251). The law of fasting prescribes or allows a single full meal each day according to accepted local custom. (III §2 Paenitemini, Paul VI, 1966) Lent is a penitential season of prayer, self-denial and helping others. In this way, the whole Church prepares for Easter with those who are to be baptised. Other celebrations must take account of the spirit on penance: musical instruments are only used to sustain singing and floral decorations are very simple. (Ordo 2022)

First Reading

A reading from the book of Genesis

God made a covenant with Abraham, his faithful servant.
